Council Shifts Collection Job

SPRINGFIELD—The city council in a special session Wednesday night passed a new ordinance designating the city recorder as the city representative to make collections on all delinquent assessments such as street, sewer and sidewalk improvements. This work had been previously delegated to the city attorney.

In other actions a resolution was adopted for the re-assessment of property on the sewer line extending from Ninth St. to Seventeenth St. south of Main St. A public hearing will be necessary before this can be accomplished. The council asked the city recorder to contact the city planning commission to expedite re-zoning plans.

The Reid Fuel Co. was granted permission by the council to establish an office and construct a neon sign in the corner of the Springfield Hotel.

Three Concerns Sign With Retail Clerks

Mrs. G. Stewart, secretary of the retail clerks union, announced Thursday that three local businesses had signed new bargaining agreements with the union, one before opening for business.

Hawkins Market, Seventeenth and Main in Springfield, signed the contract with the clerks' union while still preparing to open on or about May 31.

Lindley's Flower Shop in the Public Market signed the agreement effective this week.

Mrs. Stewart said the local was open for business in its new offices at 728 Willamette.

Robert L. Henagin, West Linn school superintendent, was shot last October in what police said was a quarrel over another woman.

Man Tells Plea In Rape Case
Robert E. Lohrke, 20, entered a plea of not guilty by reason of insanity at the time of the alleged crime when he was arraigned in circuit court Thursday on an information charging the rape of an eight-year-old girl last Jan. 22.

Lohrke was set free on \$3000 bail to await trial during the June term of circuit court.

Patrick C. Nelson, 31, was sentenced to one year in the county jail (the limit) following his plea of guilty to charges of passing a bank check without sufficient funds.

David L. Warlund, 17, and Ronald E. Sequin, 18, were arraigned on charges of grand larceny and will enter their pleas Monday.

Judge G. F. Skipworth fixed bail at \$1500 each. The pair were arrested in Roseburg by state police while riding in an auto reported stolen from Springfield. Warlund gave his home as Langley, Wash., and Sequin said he was from Grants Pass.

Student Admits Using Checks Since Fall to Obtain Funds

Sheriff C. A. Swarts Thursday said he had a signed statement from University of Oregon student George M. McClaskey, Nyssa, admitting passing 18 forged checks here and in Portland since school started last fall.

McClaskey, 19, also allegedly went by the name of George M. Billings, but the sheriff said, used seven other names on the checks that hit merchants for a total of \$744.18.

Long Work
Deputies made the arrest Wednesday after weeks of patient detective work, checking descriptions, handwriting and leads pointing to a left-handed pen artist on the campus.

McClaskey was arraigned in justice court on charges of forgery specifying one particular check and was bound over to the grand jury with bail fixed at \$2500.

McClaskey allegedly used the names of Boyd E. Cole, Allan Ingalls, Dick Wadell, Ted Meiker.
