Among the functions described by Triolo are compilation and publication of vital statistics and carrying out of communicable disease control.

immunization clinic for diphtheria, small pox and other contagious diseases. We also give tests for tuberculosis then," said Triolo. On Wednesday afternoon and evening a venereal disease clinic is held.

The health department is also charged with sanitation responsibility which includes milk purification, water distribution, and sewage disposal.

A maternal and well-child conference for infants under a year old is held on the second and third Tuesdays of the month. One a month is held also in Cottage Grove and in Florence.

**Could Double Attendance**  
"These are well attended," said Triolo. "And if we had adequate personnel we could double or triple the attendance."

A school health program is ordinarily carried out by the health department, but this year because of a shortage of help little has been done.

Triolo said also that Lane County should have a public health laboratory. At present the department has to send all test samples to Portland or in case of an emergency to a private laboratory in

Eugene, which charges a fee. When asked by a PCA member why he thought funds were not forthcoming for the department, Triolo blamed the 6 per cent minimum increase limitation on budgets. He said also that the county was just "out of funds" and that a special election to get more would be too costly and perhaps unsuccessful.

## Krug Assails GOP Discipline

**SAN FRANCISCO**—U.P.—Secretary of the Interior Julius A. Krug denounced Republican congressmen for voting the "party line" at the expense of national welfare, and predicted a presidential and congressional victory for the Democrats in 1948.

Krug told 1400 Democrats at a Jefferson Day dinner Thursday night that the "iron-fisted rule of the eastern Republican leadership over the 80th Congress" is threatening the country with "regimentation of our democracy," a business recession and the "ruin of national security."

The interior secretary said the House vote on reclamation and power projects for the West proved that GOP congressmen "must get in line—or else."

"Republican congressmen from western states wanted to vote for the things so vitally needed in the West. They just weren't allowed to," said Krug.

## Operations Scheduled For Bilbo, Churchill

**NEW ORLEANS**—U.P.—Sen. Theo G. Bilbo, (D-Miss) is scheduled to undergo a preliminary face operation here Friday.

The operation is to be followed in about a month by another to replace part of the jawbone removed several months ago because of a malignant condition.

**LONDON**—U.P.—Winston Churchill will undergo an internal operation soon, headquarters of the Conservative Party reported Friday.

"The operation is not of a very serious character," the headquarters statement said.

"We cannot say where the operation is to be performed."

## FDR Estate Valued At \$1,943,885.86

**POUGHKEEPSIE, N. Y.**—(U.P.)—The late President Franklin D. Roosevelt left a gross estate of \$1,943,885.86 at his death April 12, 1945, the first executors' accounting revealed Friday at its filing in Dutchess County Surrogate's Court.

Of the total, \$994,155.19 was received from the estate of his mother, Mrs. Sara Delano Roosevelt.

The accounting, which covered the period from April 12, 1945, to April 30, 1947, disclosed that the estate had dwindled to \$1,438,940.09 by the latter date through payment of debts and other expenses.

## More Mail-Bombs Found in England

**LONDON**—(U.P.)—Scotland Yard reported Friday that nine new letter bombs for Britons had been found in the mails, making a total of 20 discovered since early this week.

Reliable sources said that all 20 of the "murder by mail" letters had been posted in Turin, Italy. Dispatches from Jerusalem, meanwhile, said the so-called Stern Gang, Palestine Jewish underground group, had announced that its European branch has been sending the bombs.

Scotland Yard said some of the new bombs were addressed to former cabinet ministers, but refused to name any of them or to say whether Churchill was among them.

Foreign Secretary Ernest Bevin and his predecessor, Anthony Eden, were among those to whom the earlier dynamite-laden envelopes were mailed. None of the bombs has been exploded, except in police tests which have shown them powerful enough to maim or kill a man.

The new bombs, it was disclosed, came in slightly larger envelopes than those detected earlier. This confirmed Scotland Yard's belief that the bomb senders would disguise their deadly missives in new ways in an effort to foil rigid security checks now being made with descriptions of the original packets as a guide.

## Surplus Auto Parts Sales Set by WAA

**PORTLAND**—(U.P.)—Approximately \$25,000,000 worth of hard-to-get surplus automotive parts will be placed on sale Tuesday, June 10, by War Assets Administration, the Portland regional office has announced. The lists represents a new combing of the national inventory. Only veterans of World War II are eligible to buy from this critical list.

## Arms Embargo Wallace's Idea

**RALEIGH, N. C.**—U.P.—Henry A. Wallace, vigorous opponent of President Truman's foreign policy Friday advocated world-wide approval of a regulation banning shipment of arms from one nation to another.

The former "New Deal" vice president called upon the United Nations to "adopt a regulation that no nation may ship arms outside its borders."

In his first southeast address on a swing around the country Wallace urged that:

- 1—Members of the United Nations assembly be elected "directly by the people."
- 2—The world needs a peace treaty between the United States and Russia.
- 3—Mr. Truman veto the Hartley-Taft "anti-labor bill and the relief-for-the-greedy tax bill."

Wallace told a mixed audience of 2000 whites and Negroes that southern congressmen who voted for the two controversial measures "are closer to the banking interests of Wall Street than they are to the hearts of the people."

City commissioners had waived race segregation rules for the meeting, permitting Negroes to sit without restriction among whites.

**TORNADO REPORTED**  
**DENVER**—U.P.—A tornado of fierce intensity Friday was reported to have swept through the extreme northeastern town of Julesburg, Colo. An operator of the Mountain States Telephone & Telegraph Co. reported that all its lines were down, and said it had been informed that the town had been "leveled."
