

County Sugar Issue Upped

Lane County users of sugar for industrial purposes could look forward to expanding their production somewhat Friday after an Associated Press dispatch from Washington, D. C., reported that the Department of Agriculture has granted a 10 per cent increase in the county's sugar allotment.

The increase does not benefit private consumers obtaining sugar under rationing regulations, but will allow a step-up in the output of soft drinks, bakery goods and other commercial products requiring sugar.

Lester Collar, a partner in the

Home Bakery, said that the raise will bring the county's allotment up to between 88 and 90 per cent of the "normal" amount. A raise granted a year ago had given Lane a 78 per cent allotment, he added.

Consumers with a sweet-tooth also received good news in Yamhill and Marion Counties, where similar increases were granted.

The department authorized the increases on the basis of population gains, the AP story said.

Organist Gives Good Concert At UO School

A capable performance of seven representative organ works marked the Thursday evening senior recital of Lois Roeder, organist at the University of Oregon school of music.

Always equal to any tasks posed by her program, Miss Roeder played with confidence. Her performance, although seldom exciting, was consistently sound, well thought out, and worthwhile.

The program consisted of music by Frescobaldi, Bach, Franck, Reger, and Gullmunt, offering variety in registration, style, and size. In the Franck "Prelude, Fugue, and Variations," based on a magnetically rhythmic theme, Miss Roeder had an opportunity to demonstrate her coordinated handling of several complex lines.

Gullmunt's "Offertory" called forth some rapid pedal work, as well as brilliant manual playing and full-organ tone. Franck's "Andantino," on the other hand, featured romantic solo-color and sectional contrast.

The recital opened along conventional lines, with the gentle Frescobaldi "Toccata per l'Elevazione," a Bach chorale prelude, and Bach's "Preludes and Fugue in E-minor," another rhythmic complexity played in a steady, straight-forward manner by Miss Roeder.
