HAVE YOU OBEYED GOD? "Behold, to obey is better than sacrifice, and to hearken than the fat of rams." (I Sam. 15:22). them. Now what was included in this form of doctrine? "Or are ye ignorant that all we who were baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into his death? We were buried therefore with him through baptism into death: that like as Christ was raised from the dead through the glory of the Father, so we also might walk in newness of life" (Rom. 6:3-4). The "newness of life" is the state of innocence enjoyed by the saved man. Notice one reaches that state as one arises from baptism. Thus baptism is necessary to justification by faith before God.

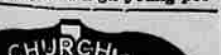
