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Long-Time Lane Residents To Mark 50th Anniversary

Mr. and Mrs. Ernest McReynolds of Cottage Grove will celebrate their 50th married year on Lane County's Centennial year with an open house this Sunday. The couple, whose home is a ranch five miles south of Cottage Grove, on Highway 99, met more than half a century ago at the Hebron Church, the site of which is now under the waters of the Cottage Grove dam. They were married at the same little church in 1897.

Home for 64 Years
The ranch where the couple live and will hold open house from 2 until 6 p.m. Sunday has been home to Mr. Reynolds for the past 64 years. In 1893, when he was 9 years old, he came to Oregon from Kansas by train from Kansas to San Francisco, by boat from San Francisco to Portland, and from Portland to Cottage Grove by wagon train.

Wife Oldtimer
Mrs. McReynolds, who was Ida

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Powell, has roots that go even deeper into the Cottage Grove soil. Her father crossed the plains with a wagon train in 1851 when he was only five years old. Her mother came across the plains two years later.

Mrs. McReynolds, very much interested in the Oregon Trail Pageant—Lane County Centennial—remembers when her brother lived in Eugene "about where Sixth and Olive is now," and he tested his new shotgun by throwing cans up in the air and shooting at them — there were no houses near enough to be in any danger.

1890 'Not So Long'
"And that wasn't so long ago, either," she said. "It was along in the 1890's."
