Glenn Griffith, Pageant chorus director, who asked for a chorus of 500 voices, announced Thursday that he now has 506 persons singing Pageant music, and he can still use some more if there are any who want to register—especially men.

The women responded 367-strong, he said, and 138 men have joined the songsters. "We can do beautifully with just what we have," Griffith said, "but we don't want to shut anyone out, so don't let this announcement stop anyone who wants to sing."

Angell Eyes Power Bill

WASHINGTON — (AP) — Rep. Homer Angell (R-Ore) said Thursday he will "set up an awful howl" unless the House Public Works Committee clearly exempts Columbia Basin projects from a bill to change some features of public power marketing.

The pending bill by Rep. George Dondero (R-Mich) would transfer from the Interior Department to the War Department the authority to market power generated at Army Engineer dams. It would direct the War Department to sell power exclusively at the generating point.

"The bill is in the form of an amendment to a flood control act," Angell said. "That means it will apply only to flood control dams."

In the Northwest, we have several types of Army dams producing power. If the bill applied up there, we would have one agency selling power from flood control dams and another selling it from the other dams.

"It would bring nothing but confusion," he said. Dondero told a reporter he was agreeable to exempting the Northwest flood control dams from the bill. He said he had intended to make the exemption in his original bill.

Austrian Court Clears Diplomat

VIENNA — (AP) — A Vienna peoples court Thursday acquitted Dr. Guido Schmidt, the Austrian foreign minister before Anschluss, of high treason charges.

The five-man court ruled that charges accusing Schmidt of betraying Chancellor Kurt Schuschnigg and engineering the 1938 Austrian link with Germany had not been proven.

"It is not the place of this court to determine the rightness or wrongness of your pre-Anschluss foreign policy," the court said. "Our task is to determine the guilt or innocence of this one man."
