## CAB Rejects Plea For Honolulu Flights

PORTLAND—(AP)—The Civil Aeronautics Board has rejected Matson Steamship Line's proposal for temporary scheduled air service between the Pacific Northwest and Honolulu pending final decision of the Northwest-Hawaii case. Portland officials were advised from Washington Friday.

In denying Matson's motion, filed May 6, for permission to start temporary service at once, the CAB held that the line "did not establish any special or unusual circumstances sufficient to require the emergency relief requested."

Matson had contended that the Northwest-Hawaii traffic was sufficient to warrant immediate scheduled air service. The steamship company was backed by Oregon Senators Guy Cordon and Wayne Morse and by the Portland Chamber of Commerce.

## Jasper Man Hurt By Car on Road

Marvin Rackley of Jasper was at Sacred Heart Hospital Friday after being struck by a car on Jasper Road Thursday.

Valley Ambulance attendants from Springfield said he suffered a broken leg, lacerated arm and head cuts, although his physician was not available for verification Friday. Driver of the car was E. M. Parker of Fall Creek, who said Rackley stepped from behind a pickup into the path of his vehicle.

## Lost Oregon Flyers Found Dead on Peak

HAMILTON FIELD, Cal.—(AP)—The bodies of Vernon C. Coulter and Mrs. V. V. Coulter of Portland, Ore., missing in Coulter's private airplane since Oct. 30, 1946, were located on Lassen Peak near Red Bluff, Cal., during the night, Army aircraft returning to this base reported Friday.

Coulter, age 34, has been missing about eight months since taking off on an ill-fated southward flight with his mother.

His wrecked plane was found on a lonely spur of Lassen Peak by Army pilot First Lt. A. F. Aigna of Hamilton Field who was on a flight from Red Bluff to Klamath Falls, Ore.

## Lane County Chest Chooses New List of Officers, Directors

Directors and officers to guide the Lane County Chest, Inc. were announced Friday by President Elmo B. Chase after this week's annual meeting. The Lane Chest is the coordinating organization for all Lane Community Chest funds.

Seven directors elected to three-year terms include Rev. Francis P. Leipzig, William B. Fort, S. W. Alexander, Alton F. Baker, Corley B. McFarland, Damon Scott, and O. A. Houghlin. There are 21 directors, of whom seven are elected each year.

**Chase to Head**  
 Chase was re-elected president. Calvin Smith was named vice-president to succeed A. C. Dixon who had served since the chest was organized in 1942. Dixon was given a vote of thanks by the membership.

Other new vice-presidents are Angus Gibson, Junction City; Damon Scott, Cottage Grove; and S. W. Anderson, Springfield. John J. Rogers was elected secretary; Roy E. Morse, treasurer, and C. K. Stalsberg, assistant treasurer.

**Finance Report**  
 Stalsberg made the financial report showing subscriptions during last fall's campaign totaled \$124,917.4. Of this amount, \$3685.65 is still listed in unpaid pledges. Cash on hand including reserves as of June 9 totaled \$43,823.83.

Chase was instructed by the directors to establish the committee for this year's campaign and the announcement of the chairman is expected to be made in the near future, he said.

## Oregonians Held For Bank Robbery

NEVADA CITY, Cal.—(AP)—Police Friday said they expected a confession from a man believed to be the third of a holdup trio who robbed the Wheatland branch of the Bank of America of \$15,000 Tuesday.

The sheriff's office reported the man, identified as Norman Byers, 27, of Oregon, was captured about 18 miles east of here Thursday night, climaxing a two-day search by posses numbering up to 200 men.

One of the bandits, Grathin Etchebarne, 32, of Lebanon, Ore., was shot and fatally wounded during the first day of the posse's hunt. The third, Richard Thurman, 23, Acampo, Cal., was captured in the chase immediately after the holdup in which two officers were wounded.

## Man Held on Coast For Alleged Violation

A. H. Krasnoff, age not listed, was held in Coquille Friday for Sheriff C. A. Swarts on charges of obtaining money under false pretenses.

The local sheriff has a warrant accusing Krasnoff of accepting down payments on construction of houses and then failing to produce the buildings.

## Oregon Democrats Divided on Wallace

PORTLAND—(AP)—Leading Oregon Democrats said Friday they had heard no plans for Henry Wallace to be a presidential candidate as reported by "an authoritative party source" at Los Angeles Thursday, and were divided in opinion on his strength.

T. G. Moore, executive secretary of the Oregon Progressive Citizens of America, said he had heard no serious talk of the candidacy but thought Wallace would make a "good showing" in Oregon.

George Lavey, former Multnomah County Democratic chairman, said, "I don't think he could win anything," but Jack Wahl, present county central committee chairman, said he thought Wallace "right now" would have a 50-50 chance.
