THE APOSTLE PAUL SAID:
"But the Spirit saith expressly, that in the later times some shall fall away from the faith, giving heed to seducing spirits and doctrines of demons, through the hypocrisy of men that speak lies, branded in their own conscience as with a hot iron; forbidding to marry, and commanding to abstain from meats, which God created to be received with thanksgiving by them that believe and know the truth" (1 Tim. 4:1-3). By this statement we learn that error was to enter the field of religion. Men were to reach the condition when they would no longer contend for the message of God.

One need not look very far to find that this prediction by the apostle Paul has come to pass. One of the largest and most influential religious bodies in the world has incorporated the doctrine of celibacy into its teaching. Further it teaches the abstinence from meats during certain days of the week and certain parts of the year. Other smaller bodies teach the necessity of abstinence from meats. The fact that these tenets have been accepted by men fully proves that the apostle was guided by the Holy Spirit in what he had to say. Further it proves that those religious bodies who follow such teaching have come about through a departure from the truth. Notice Paul's statement again: "some shall fall away from the faith." The result of their leaving the faith was to be that they would accept this teaching.

The term "the faith" in this scripture refers to the word of God by which we are governed in this age. Jude wrote concerning it: "Beloved, while I was giving all diligence to write unto you of our common salvation, I was constrained to write unto you exhorting you to contend earnestly for the faith which was once for all delivered unto the saints" (Jude 2). The need of accepting only what the word of God teaches is here emphasized by Jude. When men "fall away from the faith," they leave the position that is acceptable to God. This is exactly what has happened to those who have done as Paul said they would.

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
