

Cottage Grovers Asked to Give Opinions on Parking Meters

COTTAGE GROVE—Questionnaires, in the form of postcards, asking whether Cottage Grove should keep the parking meters installed April 30 are to be mailed to local residents by a group of businessmen who met last week to consider a petition asking for the outright removal of the meters.

The petition was signed by 77 merchants and nine persons who described themselves as owning business property. It was directed to the city council and was presented at the businessmen's meeting by Wayne Gates. The petition, however, was tabled in favor of the questionnaires. Both are expected to be presented to the city council when the postcards are returned.

Site Administration
Speakers indicated that administration of the meter system was not satisfactory.

Councilmen Faye Stewart and Fred Anderson asserted that the manner of enforcement of the parking rules could be worked out in time.

Revenue Climbs
There are 224 meters in operation here and approximately 10 fines daily for violations. Revenue from the meters has increased from \$194 during the first week of operation to \$250 last week.

Pete Anlauf was chairman of the meeting and Harvey Kelly was secretary.
