

Third Sewer Unit to Start

interceptor, which recently was started, is being constructed by Beebe, Werner and Jeske on a contract price of \$90,172. It will consist of 36, 30, 27, 24 and some 18-inch lines.

This unit of the Amazon interceptor joins the first unit at 15th and Jefferson, runs east across Amazon Creek to about the line of Pearl St., then goes south on Pearl to the city limits.

Units one and two of the Amazon interceptor system will be the "heart" of the sewer system as far as sanitary sewers are concerned, said Seeger. Present laterals are being left and provision is being made for the interceptor to take discharge from future laterals that may be built in the area it serves, he explained.

Nearing completion is the Franklin Blvd. trunk being constructed by Beebe, Werner and Jeske on a contract price of \$55,604. It consists of 30, 27, 24 and 18-inch pipe.

In addition to serving the area through which it passes, from a connection with the present line on Broadway out Franklin to the alley between Walnut St. and Fairmount Blvd., it will make possible the use of a small pumping plant in the future to take care of future sewerage of Kincaid Park and the area around Judkins Point at the east, said Seeger.

It is hoped that bids can be asked in August for a west side trunk system. This sewage will discharge into the Amazon interceptor and, because of the grade, pumping will be required to bring it to that line.

This system will serve the Chambers-Westmoreland region, and on the basis of current conditions it is estimated this west side trunk system will cost approximately \$67,000.

When the current construction is completed, Seeger estimates there will be about \$43,000 left in the sewer construction fund. To augment this he expects to ask for transfers from other unencumbered balances of about \$25,000. (Tomorrow: Special Features.)

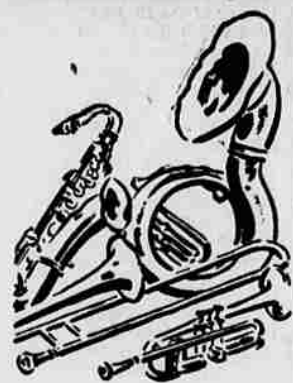
Mississippi Flood Situation Improved

HANNIBAL, Mo. — (AP) — The flood situation along the rampant Mississippi eased Saturday as the river began receding slightly after cresting below last week's record heights.

However, heavy rains elsewhere promised to prolong the high water which has inundated millions of acres of farm land and made over 20,000 persons homeless in Iowa, Illinois and Missouri in the past two weeks.

Levees, including the Sny barrier which protects 120,000 acres across the river from here, continued to hold along the 125-mile stretch from Keokuk, Ia., to Louisiana, Mo., but Army engineers maintained a constant vigil in the face of the general rainfall.

Floodwaters returned to small portions of the Hannibal and Canton business districts, but no new damage was reported in either area nor on the Illinois side in the vicinity of Quincy.

The RCA not only approves the purse money, "It keeps the boys in line," according to Christensen.

The union lays down strict rules. The men do road work, observe "no smoking, no drinking" rules during competition, and if they break any of the rules which were devised for their own safety and well-being they may be expelled from the union.

"Some of the boys clear \$1000 a week," Christensen said.

The RCA charges only \$250 a year dues, and if any rider is injured, the union takes care of his hospital expenses and looks after his family, according to the rodeo show owner.

"Very few of the boys get hurt—that's how the union can afford to do it," he said.
