Record Mississippi Flood Hits Town

GRAND TOWER, Ill. — (AP) — Flood waters coursing through a breach in a five-foot sandbag barrier Friday, covered the greater part of this Mississippi river town, 75 miles south of St. Louis.

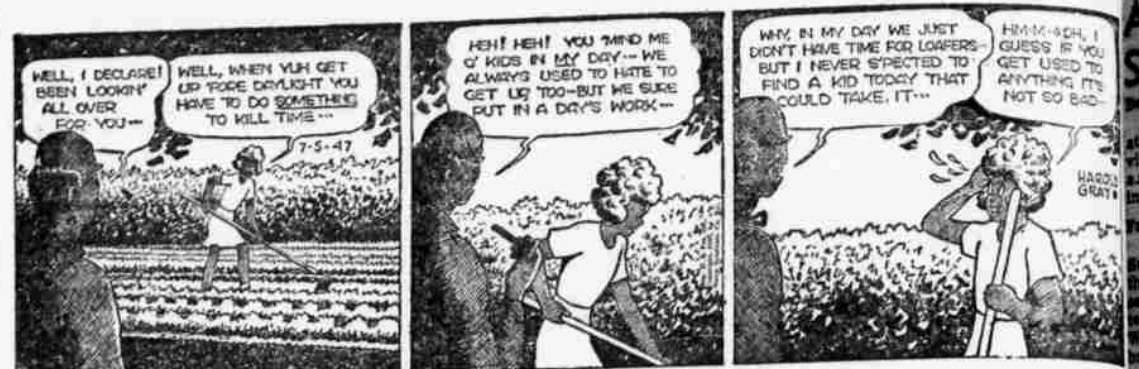
The barrier, which the 1000 inhabitants, including women and children, had labored to build, gave way Thursday night, but Mayor Jesse Grammer reported all residents reached high ground safely. A boy who suffered a foot injury was the only casualty.

Mayor Grammer called it the worst flood in the town's history. The water reached a stage of 40.1 feet, three inches higher than any previously recorded, with indications that an even higher level might be reached.
