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Springfield Streets Get Oiling, Pavement

SPRINGFIELD—A street department program is under way here for the oiling and grading of streets, according to City Manager Bill Cloyes. He said the work is beginning in the northwest part of the city and will gradually reach the east city limits.

The city made arrangements to obtain a new street sprinkler and flusher Tuesday. It will pump 150 gallons of water per minute and has a 1000 gallon capacity. Cloyes said delivery is expected within the next 30 days.

He emphasized the need for street improvements and said "people who want their streets improved must petition the city."

The policy is to require 51 per cent of the property owners on a street to sign a petition before action will be taken. He said the property owners on the street must pay for the cost of the material and the city will accomplish the work.
