Lions See Technicolor Movie Exhibiting Oregon's Scenery

The technicolor film, "This is Oregon," 30 minutes of breathtaking scenes filmed in 29 Oregon counties with a narrative prepared by Ernest Haycox, was shown before Eugene Lions at their Wednesday meeting in the Eugene Hotel.

O. E. Palmateer of Standard Oil of California showed the picture and gave a short history of the filming, explaining that the final production is the "cream of the cream" of the pictures taken—only 1120 feet of film out of the 10,000 feet taken appears in the finished version.

The picture, released last month, will be shown in Chicago, Boston, New York, Philadelphia, Washington, D. C., and other Eastern cities.
