Alaskan Village Saved From Fire

KENAI, Alaska — The village of Kenai Tuesday appeared to be saved from the sweeping Kenai peninsula fire, which has ravaged more than 400,000 acres of famed big game-hunting territory here.

Completion of a widened fire break around the town by soldiers gave inhabitants a feeling of more security from the blaze and lessened the possibility of the fire crowning the firegap as it did one other such break earlier.

The soldiers, who have been fighting the fire for several weeks, were attacking several spot fires on the other side of the Kenai firebreak.

Increased humidity and overcast skies raised hopes of saving Kenai village unless winds increase again.

U. S. Commissioner Paul Wise of Kenai paid tribute to the soldiers under Capt. Vernon Jones who have saved the village from destruction.

"They jumped in to save our town," he said, "when the fire was a scant five miles away."

Much of the manpower of this village is away a salmon fishing at this time of year, making volunteer firefighters difficult to find.

Faculty Adds Two Members

Appointment of two new professors to the faculty of the University of Oregon School of Architecture was announced Tuesday by Dean Sidney Little. The appointees are Marion Dean Ross from Pennsylvania State College, and Theodore O. Rehner of the University of North Dakota.

Dean Little said the Pennsylvania man will be assistant professor in charge of architectural history; Rehner will supplement the staff in structural architecture.

Ross is a graduate of Harvard and has attended Universidad Nacional de Mexico. His undergraduate work was done at Penn State, and he previously was assistant professor of architecture at Tulane University. His most recent appointment was as assistant professor of fine arts at Penn State.

A founder of the American Society of Architectural Historians, Ross has traveled extensively in Europe, Central and South America, and was a member of the Fifteenth International Congress of Art History in London in 1939.

Rehner obtained his doctor of philosophy degree from New York University, took graduate work at Harvard and Columbia, and won his B.S. degree in civil engineering from the Newark College of Engineering. He has been on the staffs of Newark Technical School, Cooper Union School of Engineering and Lehigh University, and has worked with the Forest Products Laboratory of the U. S. Forest Service in the Midwest.

Larger Homesteads In Alaska Voted

WASHINGTON — The House passed unanimously and sent to the Senate a bill extending to veterans the opportunity to secure larger homesteads in Alaska. The bill was sponsored by Rep. William Lemke (R-ND).

The legislation states that "the national interest requires the settlement and development of Alaska in order to make possible the full utilization of its resources and to further the national security by providing in the area a firm foundation of permanent residents."

The bill cites "the seriousness of the problems and hardships facing settlers in Alaska." It restricts the area for settlement to the panhandle and an irregular area south of latitude 63 degrees north and longitude 167 degrees 30 minutes west, and adjacent islands.

Homesteads under the provisions of the bill are to be not less than 320 acres or more than 1920 acres, depending upon the type of land, its location and the uses to which it may be put. Homesteads previously have been limited to 160 acres.

Up to two years service in the armed forces is credited as actual residence for the veteran. Three years residence is required to make final proof of claim.

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Hungary's Reds Now Unopposed

BUDAPEST — The Hungarian Freedom Party Tuesday announced its own dissolution rather than risk the "life and safety of its members in opposing the leftist coalition government."

The announcement of the oppositionist dissolution was made in a letter read to Parliament during debate on a proposed revision of the election laws.

Deputies of the Freedom Party at once walked out of the assembly in a body.

Search Party Checks Plane Crash Report

GOLD BEACH, Ore. — The sheriff's office was planning to send a search party into rough wooded country along the California-Oregon border to check a report of a plane crash between Brookings, Ore., and the Illinois Valley airport.

The sheriff's office here said that an unidentified Eureka, Cal., pilot reported sighting the wreckage of the aircraft bore the star insignia of the U. S. Army Air Forces.

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Local Army Lieutenant Gets University Post

First Lieutenant John W. Schreiner, Jr., 482 Jefferson St., Eugene, Tuesday was assigned as instructor in military science and tactics at Lehigh University.

President Martin D. Whitaker announced. He will teach Army engineering courses.

Before entering the Army in June, 1941, he attended the University of Portland and the University of Oregon. He has been decorated with the Legion of Merit and the Purple Heart for service in North Africa and Italy.

The Italian government conferred upon him the Military Cross of Valor.
