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Local Orchardists Not Worried By Glutted Peach Markets

The United Press said Friday that hundreds of thousands of tons of ripe freestone peaches are hanging unpicked in Oregon and California because of a glutted market, but Lane County peach orchardists seemed unconcerned.

Roy Corum of Norkenize said there are just about enough peaches in the county to supply local demand, but that current wholesale prices of 30 cents for a five-pound box may come down in a day or two. At the public market, retailers reportedly lowered their prices from 65 to 59 cents a box to aid in moving the freestone peaches.

United Press said other orchardists in Oregon threatened to let their bumper crops rot on the trees unless the market demand improves. Corum stated the Lane County crop of early peaches is a little light, compared with last year.

In San Francisco, the surplus was blamed on the early maturing of California's freestones and the late ripening of Georgia's crop. As a result, both crops hit the market at the same time, increasing the supply tremendously. The Chamber of Commerce in San Francisco was launching a campaign to urge housewives to buy the peaches for home canning to help liquidate the surplus.

Oregon orchardists reportedly were selling the best varieties of Elbertas, Golden Jubilees and Rochesters for 65 cents a 16-pound flat in carload lots. Such prices fall to cover cost of production, they said.

Elbertas for canning will be on the market here in three to four weeks, and are expected to sell for about three dollars a bushel on the retail market, Corum stated.

Oregon Fish Said Biting

PORTLAND — (AP)—The State Game Commission Friday gave weekend anglers a tip; try Walla Walla County streams for trout.

In its weekly fishing prospectus, the commission said Walla Walla streams were "just right" for fly fishing with the upper and north Minam streams and high lakes producing limit catches of brook trout regularly.

Fishing conditions elsewhere in the state were spotty.

Lane County lakes and streams were described as good, but nothing much was reported during the past week from Hood River, Washington or Yamhill counties.

The coastal section offered poor prospects except in Curry County where fair catches of salmon near the mouth of the Rogue River were being taken.

Trout fishing was reported good in the upper North and South Umpqua Rivers in Southern Oregon, fair in Union County and poor in Morrow, Wheeler and Gilliam Counties where the water level is low.

Ex-Prisoner of War Wishes More Study

Another indication that correspondence studies put out by the State System of Higher Education go all over the world has come with the request of Lothar Freund of Germany that his correspondence work be continued.

In a letter to Miss Mozelle Hair, head of correspondence studies with offices on the University of Oregon campus, Freund explains that he wishes to resume the course in elementary news writing.

A former prisoner of war detained in Oregon, the German man took the course while here and then was forced to discontinue his study when he was sent to England in 1946, because he was unable to find the textbook there. Now back in Germany, he has found the text and wants to continue his journalistic study, he reports.
