OAKRIDGE—A special meeting was held at the high school Monday evening to vote on changing the original agreement regarding the new grade school.

The taxpayers agreed to stay within the board's recommendation and build only the first unit of the new school at this time. The unit will consist of eight class rooms and in addition to this a locker room and

heating facility will be erected. At a previous meeting of the taxpayers it was decided that the building must be constructed of concrete blocks, brick or pumice blocks. It is left up to the decision of the board what material to use and as soon as they decide, notices of the bond election will be posted for fifteen days and construction on the building will start as soon after as possible.
