

State Police To Add Men

The state police force at Eugene will be strengthened by the addition of several new members in the near future, according to a letter from H. G. Malson, superintendent of Oregon state police at Salem.

One member has already been assigned to the Eugene office for work in game protection service, and two others now attending school in Klamath Falls will report to Sergeant Verne Hill soon for further training and assignment to duty in traffic patrol. Malson revealed.

A second group of newly appointed members will assemble for schooling in Klamath Falls when the first class has finished," the superintendent wrote. "From these further assignments as can be made, consistent with other needs, will be made to the Eugene area. It is our intention to strengthen all existing patrols operating over the principal arteries of travel and to give improved service to all secondary highways which of necessity are being patrolled only occasionally."

**California Insect Fails
In Gresham 'Invasion'**

PORTLAND — (AP) — Gresham berry growers Friday reported that a new insect invader apparently has been stopped without damage to berry crops in Oregon.

The pest is known as the "orange trolox," an invader from California orange groves.

J. J. Fisher, manager of the Gresham Berry Growers Cooperative, said it had appeared in three fields near Gresham, but prompt control measures prevented loss.

A spray program is expected to wipe out the invader next spring.
