Police Kept Alert by Boys

The Eugene Police department Thursday, after successfully locating one missing boy through a story in the Register-Guard, had a request to locate another. A United Press dispatch from San Francisco stated that Ferdinand C. Stoltz, 15, Alameda, Calif., was sought by his parents who believed he had driven to Eugene July 29. He had not been heard from since.

The local police had received no official notice of the missing boy other than the press dispatch but said they would welcome any information for his parents.

The boy located was Ronald Lee Kenniston, 13, whose relatives had inquired as to his whereabouts when they learned he was staying with a grandmother in Eugene.

State Hospital Plan Approved

SALEM — (AP) — The State Board of Control Friday had authorized to go ahead with a \$866,489 treatment hospital at the Eastern Oregon State Hospital at Pendleton.

A bid of \$782,740 for a patient's cottage, employees' dormitory and a laundry building at the Fairview Home near here, however, was rejected in the joint session of the Board of Control and the Emergency Board Thursday. It was the third rejection for the project.

Secretary of State Robert S. Farrell, Jr., said he would ask the Board of Control at its next meeting to close the home to new patients until more room is available.

The 114-bed hospital at Pendleton was authorized after Dr. Donald Wair said the institution would be enabled to handle more patients, cut down the time the patients must stay in the hospital, and boost the number of recoveries.

Sen. Dean Walker, Independence, offered the only objection, saying he could not approve expenditures for large public building projects while the public was in need of housing.

The Fairview project was rejected because of high costs, the latest bid being larger than one turned down earlier.

Completion of the project is not expected until spring, however.

Fruit Growers Take Corn Crop at Cannery

The Eugene Fruit Growers Assn. announced Friday that they were now accepting corn at the cannery. E. I. Pitkin, manager, said that the crop of early-planted corn will undoubtedly be a large one and picking should last for about 50 days.

Pitkin explained that the canned corn is supplied to eastern markets as well as the Pacific coast. It is expected that one shift of workers will be able to handle the anticipated volume.

Fears are also being accepted for cold storage, Pitkin stated, and canning should begin in two or three weeks. He estimated that once canning starts, two shifts of workers would be kept busy for approximately 35 days.

Attorney Joins Firm After Portland Post

Washington Governor Against Game Laws

OLYMPIA, Wash., Aug. 8.—(AP)—Gov. Mon C. Wallgren recommended to the state game commission Friday that it will ignore new federal game regulations to take effect Aug. 31.

Wallgren told a commission meeting Thursday night that he was opposed to lending the state game department's 70 wardens to the enforcement of federal migratory bird regulations. His recommendation would leave enforcement of the new regulations throughout the state to only two federal game wardens.

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Parents Reminded Of Physical Exams

Dr. M. Marr, city school health officer, Friday reminded parents that only three weeks remain for the required medical reports on first graders, kindergarten students, and those entering the city school system for the first time.

Dr. Marr pointed out that parents of children who will enter any of the Eugene schools (District 4) may secure forms at her office in the city hall. The completed forms are due on the opening day of school or sooner if possible, the doctor said.

Parents of children in other county schools not part of the city district may secure forms from the county school office or their family doctor, who in most cases will give the necessary examination and immunizations required by state law.

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
