

Seattle Star Ends Publication

SEATTLE—(AP)—The Seattle Star, afternoon Seattle daily newspaper, Wednesday announced that it was suspending publication immediately.

The announcement was made in a box on the front page of Wednesday's paper by the owners, R. W. Parish and Associates. The announcement said that increasing costs, particularly of newsprint and labor, had forced the management into the decision.

Sackett Deal

Early this year Sheldon Sackett, Oregon newspaper publisher, obtained an option on the Star, but later failed to fulfill the option and the Parish group retained control. Recent negotiations between Sackett and J. David Stern, former Philadelphia publisher, for the

purchase of the option were unsuccessful.

The Seattle Post-Intelligencer, morning Seattle newspaper, carried a Wednesday story saying that sale of the Star to the Seattle Times, an afternoon daily, was rumored.

Elmer E. Todd, president and publisher of the Times, said that negotiations have been going on, but refused to comment further.

Parish and the management of the Star had no comment on the rumored sale to the Times.
