**5500 Lumber Mill

The agreements covered the Western Cedar Pole Preserving Co. at Yardley, the E. C. Olson Co. of Spokane and the D. C. Moe Co. in North Dakota. The Idaho firm did not go out on strike.

WOOL CROP LESS

PORTLAND —(AP)— Oregon wool production dropped 7 per cent this year to 6,345,000 pounds, the Federal Crop Reporting Service reported Wednesday. The reduction was attributed to a decline in the number of sheep from 1946. The service said the average fleece weight this year was 8.3 pounds compared with 8.5 last year.

**Howard Hughes to Resume
Work on Planes Contracts**

LOS ANGELES —(AP)— Howard Hughes said he was convinced Wednesday that his battle with Sen. Owen D. Brewster has just begun.
He said he had no doubt that a recess in a Senate investigation of his war contracts meant that Brewster, the committee chairman, had "just begun to fight."
"He has an unlimited capacity for hitting below the belt," Hughes said. During the investigation of \$40,000,000 worth of war contracts, Hughes accused Brewster of blackmail and being the Senate mouthpiece for Pan-American Airways. Brewster accused Hughes of lying.
The millionaire manufacturer and movie producer was back at work Wednesday on tests of his photo-reconnaissance plane. He had interrupted the tests to defend the plane before the committee.
He came home from the hearings Tuesday night, feeling he was no longer "behind the eight ball" but still wary of the Maine Republican.
"I suppose I'll regret the rest of my life that I tangled with Brewster," he said.
"I don't minimize his capacity for dirty dealing, and I have no doubt that, as he says, he has just begun to fight."
Hughes said pressure of work on the XF-11 photo plane, in which he was nearly killed during a test flight last year, would keep him from taking any vacation.
"I'm going to get caught up on my work," he said. "This last month has been completely wasted."
