**Hints Given For County Fair Exhibit**  
(Ed's Note—This is first in a series of instructions and hints for women planning to enter exhibits in the 1947 County Fair.)  
Women in Lane County who pride themselves on being good cooks will have an opportunity to display their skills at the Lane County Fair, this year, announces Mrs. Beth Wiley, Lane County Home Demonstration Agent. Release of sugar controls early in the year made it possible to increase the entry lists for cakes and pastries, canned fruits, jams, jellies and pickles.  
The recipe must accompany each entry in the baked foods division. Arrange foods attractively, and with neat labels.  
The Foods Department includes two classes of baked goods: breads, cakes and pastries. The main rule for entering these items is that the recipe accompany each entry. Usually, one loaf of bread constitutes an entry, as does one dozen rolls, or one-half dozen baking powder biscuits.  
The homemaker who plans to exhibit this year, will be interested that angel cakes are not in competition with sponge cakes, and very often are displayed, iced. Butter cakes are usually iced. Cookies should be of uniform size, shape and color. Both one and two crust pies are included in the list and one pie will constitute an entry.  
Directions for displaying canned foods will be given next week. Meanwhile, if anyone wishes to check the complete list of entries in the different classes, the premium books for the 1947 Fair can be seen at the County Agent's office.

**Recipe**  
**Ragout of Sweetbread and Asparagus**  
1 clove garlic  
6 tablespoons butter or margarine  
6 tablespoons flour  
2 cups chicken stock  
1 cup cream  
Dash paprika  
Dash nutmeg  
2 egg yolks, beaten  
1 pair sweetbreads, cooked  
2 cups canned asparagus, cut in small pieces  
Baked noodle ring  
Rub saucepan with garlic. Melt butter or margarine and blend in flour. Add cream to chicken stock, then gradually add to butter-flour mixture. Cook over low heat, stirring until smooth and thickened. Add seasonings. Pour onto egg yolks and cook for two minutes longer. Break sweetbreads in pieces and add with asparagus. Heat and serve in baked noodle ring.
