Less than three weeks remains for Oregonians to register for voting on the state sales cigarette tax proposals, Lloyd Howe pointed out Thursday.

Deadline for registration is Sept. 6. The election will be held Oct. 7.

Howe, deputy Lane County

clerk, urged all those who have not voted for the last two elections to re-register because their names are now off the precinct rolls.

Egg Production Smaller in Lane

Egg output in the Lane area for the first seven months of this year is from two to four per cent below that for the same period in 1946, according to the records of local egg dealers. They said that the principal reason for the decreased production is the current high feed prices.

Because of these high prices, greater quantities of eggs are being imported from Midwestern states, notably Iowa, Minnesota, and Nebraska, one Eugene dealer said. He explained that lower feed costs in those states makes it possible for western dealers to purchase eggs at a cheaper price despite freight charges.

However, the opinion generally held is that these imported Midwestern eggs are of distinctly lower grade than those produced in Oregon. Although they are shipped as Grade A products, most of them are down-graded to a "B" rating on local markets, dealers are agreed.

Some Oregon eggs are shipped to San Francisco because of the better market conditions existing there and the resulting higher prices obtainable. Egg merchants pointed out that California is now

importing more eggs from Oregon because of low production in the former state, increased population, and climatic conditions.

It is expected that egg production will pick up during the balance of the year. Dealers explained that there is a very good pullet flock being raised this season and that the number of eggs should increase appreciably as soon as the flock starts laying.

Church Historians Attend UO Meeting

Outstanding church historians of the nation met on the University of Oregon campus Tuesday and Wednesday, Aug. 19 and 20, to discuss the problems of church history in this area and of expansion within the area.

Heading the group as guest lecturer for the conference of the Pacific division of the American Society of Church History was Dr. John J. McNeill, professor of church history in Union Theological Seminary, New York. Attending the meetings and discussing common problems with members was Dr. Kenneth Scott Latourette, former Oregonian who religion in Yale's graduate school.

Papers for the meetings were prepared by Dr. H. G. Townsend, head of Oregon's department of philosophy; Dr. Henry M. Shires, Alameda, Cal.; Dr. Hoyt Trowbridge, associate professor of English at Oregon; Dr. Dan E. Clark, head of the Oregon department of history; Dr. Douglas H. Telfer, president of the United Church of Canada, Conference of British Columbia; Dr. Sanford Fleming, Berkeley (Cal.) Baptist Divinity School; Dr. Paul B. Means, head of Oregon's religion department; and Dr. Quirinus Breen, associate professor of social science and history in Oregon.

Society members attending the meetings included Clifford H. Jope of San Francisco; Dr. Arnold Crompton, minister of the First Unitarian church of Oakland, Cal., and vice-president of the board of trustees of the Starr King School for the Ministry in Berkeley; Richard T. Owen, Oregon; Dr. Ross J. Griffith, president of the Northwest Christian College, Eugene; and the Rev. Frank S. Biesel, retired minister of the United Lutheran church of Eugene.
