Lions Club Informed of Ideograph Usage In Place of Alphabet in the Far East

Lions Club Member Larry Fischer, who topped off his wartime career as an Air Force officer by attending military government school and then doing a tour of duty in Korea with Far East Civil Affairs, entertained the club at its Wednesday noon meeting in the Eugene Hotel with a history of Chinese ideographs and their evolution and combination into a written, stylized language.

Using a blackboard for illustrative purposes, Fischer drew several of the simple "radicals"—signs used either by themselves or as combining forms to make more complex words and ideas. Then he showed how to compound the signs.

Picture Influence
Part of the picturesqueness of the Oriental languages, he pointed out, comes from the picture base of their spoken tongue. "For instance," he said, "the verb 'to see' is written by drawing the symbol for an eye and then attaching legs to it to give the idea of the eye going somewhere."

As another illustration he drew the two symbols for "to stand" and "center," which together mean "neutrality."

He capped his talk with the information that the Japanese symbol for the United States is the combination of "rice" and "country."

"They explain this," he said, "by saying that the United States is a very rich country, and since to them rice is the basis for riches, our country is known to them as Rice Country."

Lion First Vice-President Dr. A. T. Oberg presented Lion A. L. Hawn with a badge signifying 10 years of perfect attendance. Lion President C. E. McLean congratulated the club on having Hawn as a member.
