

Turkey Growers Predict Drop In Numbers, Not in Prices

With the turkey market season expected to open Sept. 1, local growers estimated the Lane County crop would be at least 30 per cent under last year's — with a good market for both hens and toms and the national cold storage figures placed at about 14,000,000 pounds under a year ago.

Over the state, the U.S. Department of Agriculture estimated the Oregon crop as the smallest since 1938 or 20 per cent under last season's. USDA estimated the total at 1,639,000 birds and said a market shortage was not expected, according to the Associated Press.

Feed Shortage

Clyde Hanson, Creswell, said a

shortage of feed last year and high feed prices this year had forced many growers to reduce their flocks or discontinue turkey raising altogether.

Hanson said he expected the market to go to 50 or 62 cents a pound over the fall holidays because of the reduced crop, which he estimated at 30 per cent below last year for Lane County, and the lower poundage in cold storage.

He said growers would have a more accurate picture of the national and state turkey situation after a Sept. 17 meeting at Salem.

According to the United States census of agriculture for 1945, Lane County raised 233,268 turkeys that year. Current figures for the county were estimated at around 150,000.

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Water Main Addition To Give City Service

Eugene Water Board employees Friday were laying a 12-inch water main on Eighteenth Ave. W. from Chambers St. to the western city limits, to give city water service to some residents of the Chambers-Westmoreland area in a few weeks.

A 16-inch main already has been laid on Chambers St. to a point where it intersects with Eighteenth Ave. W. An eight-inch line has been installed from the intersection of Chambers and Eighteenth to the south city limits.

Residents living along the new line will be able to hook up with city water mains this fall, water board officials said.

Springfield's total rate includes 6.1 mills levied by the Willamalane Park District.

The new taxes rates reflect increased aid to cities, school districts and the county. The rise in school rates results in general from the fact that, even with increased aid, additional money is required to finance building expansion, hire additional teachers or pay higher salaries and higher prices for materials and equipment.

Portland Opposes Phone Rate Hike

PORTLAND — (AP) — The city commissioner in charge of public utilities, Dorothy McCullough Lee, said Friday that Portland opposes emergency telephone rate increases in Oregon.

The Pacific Telephone & Telegraph Co. has requested such increases while an investigation of possible permanent increases continues.

Mrs. Lee declared the company was earning more in Oregon than in other far western states, and that its increases should be made in California, Washington, and Idaho.

Merlin Halderson placed first in the swine division with a perfect score of 200, Louis Dunlap took fourth in sheep and seventh on total individual score, and Jim McFadden placed first in dairy.

At the Washington County Fair held at Hillsboro Aug. 28, the team placed fourth with a total of 2849 points out of a possible 3600. Louis Dunlap placed sixth high on individual score, and the team placed third in sheep, second in beef, third in Jersey cows, second in Guernsey cows and fifth in Holsteins.
