## Lorane Is Host To Big Rodeo

LORANE — Rodeo fans of this community need not plan a trip to Pendleton or elsewhere to satisfy that longing to hear "Ride 'em, cowboy!" (and see them bite the dust) for, come Sunday and Labor Day, a two-day rodeo will be held at the Dyson ranch (formerly Spreckels), just two miles east of Lorane.

Sponsored by the Cottage Grove Riding Club, features for the Sunday show are: flag race, pony express race, bull race, and musical rope.

Monday attractions are: apple race, relay race, stake-bending race, musical chair, and stallion show.

Other events scheduled for each day are: calf roping, under 18 years of age; 1/4 mile girls' saddle horse race, under 18 years; steer riding; mare and colt race; free-for-all cowgirls' race; calf roping and tying; novelty race—walk, trot and run; bull riding, boys' 1/4 mile race, under 18 years of age; wild cow milking; jumping race; work-horse race—1/4 mile; men's and boys' free-for-all—1/4 mile; bucking horses.

Bucking and corral chutes are being built, and the club has arranged for the hire of six bucking horses from Mr. George of Eugene. These will not be eligible for prizes. A "mystery funny man" with his bucking donkey will furnish amusement both days. Prizes are being donated by merchants. Creswell Riding Club and Timberline Riders of Sutherline will each have a representative there.

Lorane Grange will have ice cream, pop, hot dogs and other refreshment concessions. Chairman Lucille Mitchell asks that all grange members attend, to help with the booths.

## Monroe Starts School Sept. 15

MONROE — Pre-registration at the Monroe Union High School is Monday and Tuesday, Sept. 8 and 9, beginning at 9 a. m. All students planning to enter school should register on these days. The opening date has been set for Sept. 15.

Freshmen and students entering the high school here for the first time should have health forms completed by the opening date. Blanks for this purpose are available at the Monroe State Bank.

The Monroe high school will have an additional teacher this year, making a faculty of six compared to five in previous years. Mrs. Myrtle Malcom will teach all English classes, Spanish, and hand-drawn. Mrs. Alice Carson will teach high school arithmetic, algebra, business arithmetic, and bookkeeping. Three new teachers: Miss Barbara Parks who did practical teaching here last year and who is a graduate of Oregon State will teach typing, shorthand, office procedure, and journalism, as well as having charge of the library. Mrs. Elizabeth Van Leeuwen, a graduate of Oregon State last June will teach home economics, world geography, and girls' physical education. Donald Taylor who graduated from the University of Oregon in June will teach shop, general science, biology, and boys' physical education. John B. Gibson, principal, will teach United States history, socio-economics, and one class in physical education.

Subjects offered this year will differ some from those offered last year. Courses in shorthand, Spanish, biology, and algebra will be new this year. Chemistry and English III will not be offered. Two classes in boys' physical education, two in high school arithmetic, two in shop, and two in home economics will be included in the curriculum. A course in speech may also be added.

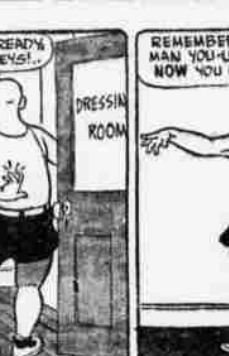
