**Java Battle Still Rages**  
 LAKE SUCCESS, N. Y. — The Indonesian Republic told the United Nations Security Council this week that the Netherlands still was attacking Indonesian territory and committing atrocities in Java and Sumatra in defiance of the UN cease-fire order.  
 L. N. Palar of the Indonesian Republic urged the council to order a complete report on Dutch activities from the UN "Good Offices" Commission now on the spot. He said the Dutch were trying to sever the rest of Indonesia from the Indonesian Republic.  
 The United States objected, however, through Delegate Warren R. Austin. He said such a request to the UN commission might reflect on "the wisdom and honesty and dignity and ability" of the UN investigators who have been in Indonesia for several months on orders to negotiate a truce between fighting Dutch and Indonesian factions.
