

The Bar Groups Plan Meet Eugene on Friday, Saturday

Second appearance of the bar groups of the Oregon State Bar is scheduled for Friday and Saturday, Jan. 9 and 10, when that group will hold a business meeting with members of the University of Oregon School of Law.

The board of examiners will meet before the students will meet. Nine members of the State Bar of Oregon will be present.

The program will begin with a meeting of law students at 8 p.m. Friday, in the law school. At this time the two groups will be introduced to the students.

The president of the Oregon State Bar, W. W. Baldersee, will speak on the organization, objectives and work of his group, and Lamar Toole, chairman of the board of bar examiners, will speak on the objectives and policies of the examining board. A third speech by an as yet unnamed member of the board of governors is scheduled.

At a Saturday luncheon the two groups will meet with members of the local bar, and will attend the Oregon-Washington basketball in the evening.

The board of governors is composed of 12 elected members, three from each congressional district. Eugene is represented by W. P. Riddelsbarger. Eugene attorney William Fort represents this district on the board of examiners.

UO Library Changes Told

Students at the University of Oregon will no longer be issued library cards, according to an announcement by Dr. R. C. Swank, librarian.

Under the new system, students will use student activity cards to acquire books from the library. However, library cards already issued will be honored until date of expiration.

Dr. Swank said the system is being started as an experiment, and if successful, will be continued. It will not affect townspeople holding library cards. Townspeople will still be issued the regular library card upon request.

A new method of assessment and payment of library fines is also being instituted, whereby the student will either pay his fine at the business office upon notification by the library, or the fine will be deducted from the students' breakage fee. Townspeople will continue to pay fines for overdue books at the circulation desk.
