Vatican Envoy Recall Asked

WASHINGTON — (AP) — A new organization of Protestant churchmen, devoted to "separation of church and state," asked this week that President Truman end the practice of sending a personal envoy to the Vatican.

Although emphasizing it had no intention of criticizing the teachings or doctrines of the Roman Catholic Church, the organization said the church had made "ominous progress in its strategy of winning for itself a position of special privilege in relation to the state."

The Protestant group asked immediate recall of Myron Taylor, President Truman's personal envoy to the Vatican. Mr. Truman, who conferred with Taylor Friday, has reassured Protestant leaders in the past that there is no permanency to Taylor's post.

The new organization is known as "Protestants and other Americans United for the Separation of Church and State."

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STATE TIMBER SALE

Oral auction bids will be received by Lynn F. Cronmiller, State Forester, at Western Lane Forest Protective Association, Veneta, Oregon, beginning at 11 o'clock A. M. January 14, 1948, for the timber designated for cutting by the State Forester or his agent following described lands located in Lane County, Oregon:

Timber only amounting to 3,500 MBF more or less of mixed Douglas fir and second growth Douglas fir on the ELYNNE, NE 1/4, NW 1/4, W 1/2, NE 1/4, Section 13, Township 18 North, Range 12 West, W. M.

Property lines are NOT run and will be the responsibility of the bidder.

Minimum prices that will be accepted are as follows: \$80.00 per M for old growth fir and \$30.00 per M for second growth fir, payment to be made on the basis of a scale by a scaler.

Sealed bids, accompanied by required payments, received by the State Forester, Western Lane Forest Protective Association, Veneta, Oregon, to 11 o'clock A. M. January 14, 1948, will be considered the successful bid to be applied to the purchase price, returned to the unsuccessful bidder to be retained as liquidated damages should the successful bidder fail to qualify under the terms of the timber sale prospectus, and a check in a similar amount must be shown to be in possession of the State Forester as a qualification for such auction bidding. If an oral bid is made at the closing of the auction, the bidder must immediately make the payment and confirm the bid as submitted in writing on a State of Oregon Board of Forestry bid form.

A copy of the prospectus and bid form may be secured from the State Forester, Salem, Oregon, or from District Warden, Western Lane Forest Protective Association, Veneta, Oregon.

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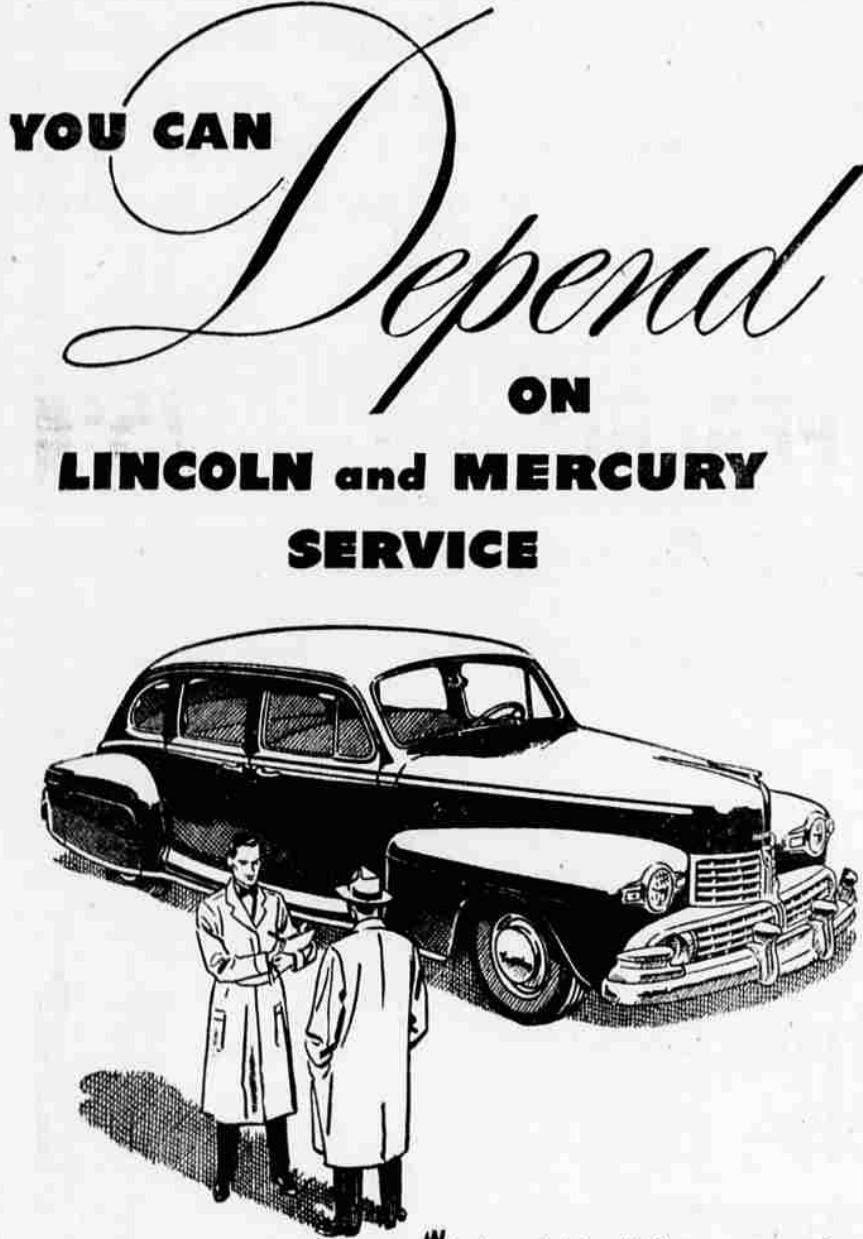
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
