Leaburg Kids Have New School Hours

LEABURG — Classes at the grade school will start a half-hour earlier, Monday, Jan. 19. Classes will be at 8:30 instead of 9, since at mid-year the time changes so that the bus, jointly owned by Deerhorn and Leaburg can transport the Leaburg students first, and then take the Deerhorn students to their classes, which will now begin at 9.

Thurston School Budget Posted

THURSTON—The grade school budget for the coming school year has been posted in various parts of the district and also notices for the budget meeting to be held at the grade school Thursday evening, Jan. 29 at 8 p. m. at which time, the qualified voters within the district will consider the proposed budget.

According to the prepared document, \$36,685 will be needed to operate the school with an estimated income of \$10,584.61, which leaves \$26,100.39 that must be raised by special tax within the district. The principal headings for the proposed expenditures are: general fund, \$515; supervision (principal), \$3000; teaching, \$15,710; operation of plant, \$3775; maintenance and repair, \$700; auxiliary agencies, \$4530; fixed charges, \$170; capital outlay, \$1200; emergency, \$3000; debt service, \$3215; special improvement sinking fund (new bus) \$500.

Petitions are being circulated to call a special meeting to put before the voters the proposal for consolidation of the local grade school with the Springfield district. Petitions for the same purpose are also circulating in Springfield.

Officials state that consolidation would definitely not do away with our local school but full use would be made of local buildings and equipment, probably for the first six grades, with seventh and eighth grades being transported to junior high school in Springfield, should the consolidation be voted.
