Red Cross Explains Disaster Aid Work

Mrs. Cora Pirtle clarified the position of the Lane County Chapter of the American Red Cross and its disaster work in regard to residents of the Mohawk, or any other, flood areas Friday in answer to a request for information received by the Register-Guard.

The request specifically asked whether there was any provision for assistance to people on the Mohawk whose property was damaged or lost in the last flood. Mrs. Pirtle explained that the Red Cross stands ready to meet the needs of any person who suffers damage in a disaster. She asked that such persons contact the local Red Cross and a worker would be sent out to interview them.

The chairman of the Mohawk disaster committee is Jerry Metcalf, principal of the Mohawk Union High School at Marcola, Mrs. Pirtle said.

The Army Engineers at Eugene said Thursday that as far as they knew there were no plans for flood control work on the Mohawk River at present.

Vatican Said Cool to Franco

ROME.—(P)—The Communist newspaper L'Unita said this week recent visits of Spanish prelates to the Holy See indicated the Vatican was withdrawing "unconditioned support" from the regime of Generalissimo Francisco Franco.

"The Vatican has felt a growing attitude of serious opposition to the Franco regime among Spaniards and consequently has instructed its representatives in Spain to limit to the minimum their formal manifestations and avoid, where possible, sharing too openly the responsibilities of Franco's policy," it said.

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Youth Church Starts Sunday

Rev. Wesley G. Nicholson Friday announced a new type of church service for teen-age youth. They will conduct the services themselves.

A Youth Church for high school students is an entirely new idea in Eugene. Rev. Nicholson says. It is based on the philosophy that youth want meaningful, dignified worship devoted specifically to their interests and needs and that the best way to provide for religious training is to have a weekly church service equal in importance with the traditional morning worship.

The forty-five minute worship service will be held in the main auditorium of the Congregational Church each Sunday at 7 p. m. High school students will plan and conduct the service. Young people and adults are cordially invited to attend. Rev. Nicholson will speak each Sunday evening on subjects of special interest to the present generation of young people.

A youth choir, under the direc-

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tion of Miss Mary Grubbs, and a high school soloist will provide the music for each service.

The first service is this Sunday January 25, with Frances Lowry and Bruce Chase, both active leaders in Eugene High, conducting the worship service. Rena White, well-known soloist in high school affairs, will sing "O Lord Most Holy" by Franck. Sandra Plass is in charge of altar arrangements.

Immediately following the worship service each Sunday evening, Plymouth House, the youth recreation building, will be open until 9 p. m. for table games, ping pong, pool, volleyball, badminton and informal dancing. Coke and cookies will be available. Any Vincent, active sophomore at University High, will be in charge of Plymouth House.

A weekly paper, edited by Kit-

ty Lou Shaw and a staff of assistants, will be distributed during the recreation hour each week, with news and views of events and program by the students.
