Governor Hall Due in Eugene For Jr. First Citizen's Banquet

Governor John Hall's first address before a Eugene audience since he succeeded the late Earl Snell will be heard by persons attending Wednesday night's annual junior first citizen banquet at the Eugene Hotel.

James Rodman, Jr., president of the Eugene Junior Chamber of Commerce, sponsoring organization for the first citizen contest, has announced that tickets for the banquet and the semi-formal dance to follow are approximately two-thirds sold already.

Ticket Sales They are available at the First National Bank, the Chamber of Commerce offices and at Weisfield and Goldberg's.

Eugene's outstanding junior citizen for 1947, a man not over 35 selected according to his participation and leadership in civic services enterprises, will be announced at the banquet, and will be given a symbolic plaque by the governor.

The banquet will also see the

naming of Eugene's first "future first citizen," a high school youth, and his presentation of a \$100 savings bond which two Jaycee members have donated.

Finalists were entered by each of the city's three high schools, and the winner of the award will be selected by the anonymous five-man committee whom the Jaycees selected as non-partisan judges for both the "junior" and "future" citizen competitions.

Rodman also has announced that dinner music will be provided during the banquet by a 15-piece section of the Eugene junior symphony. Playing for the dance will be Freddie Yahn's orchestra. The evening's program includes a "cheerio hour" at 8:30, the banquet at 7:30 and the dance at 9:30.

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Glenwood Man To Head Parks

SPRINGFIELD—W. E. James, Glenwood businessman, was re-elected to the presidency of the

Willamalane Park and Recreation district board of directors at the first 1948 meeting of the new five-man board.

Carl Lewis, city councilman and one of the three new members of the board, was elected secretary. He replaces E. H. Silke, public school superintendent, who held that position until Jan. 1. Silke was defeated in a campaign for

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re-election to the board in the park district elections last November.

The last state legislature increased park district boards from three to five members and the Willamalane panel now consists of James, Lewis, W. E. Cyphert, Kermit Alexander and Dr. Melville S. Jones.

The three new members drew lots at the meeting with Cyphert gaining the five-year term, Alexander four years and Lewis three years.

James has two years yet to serve and Dr. Jones one.

Beginning next year, one new board member will be elected each year for a five-year term.



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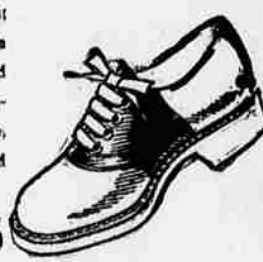
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
