District Attorney Files Notice Of Intention to Seek Job Again

C. E. Luckey, Eugene, filed papers in Salem Wednesday to seek nomination as a Republican candidate for reelection as Lane County district attorney. He stated in his application that if nominated and elected he would "honestly, vigorously, and impartially prosecute violation of the criminal laws of the State of Oregon committed in and triable in Lane County without fear or favor."

"I will also during my term of office be ever watchful to prevent encroachments upon the constitutional rights of any accused person."

Deputy Choice
 "Finally it shall be my aim to have as deputy district attorneys only persons fully qualified and worthy of public trust."

Luckey was appointed Nov. 16, 1946, to fill the unexpired term of W. W. Bartle and has served as district attorney since that time.

Party Worker
 In 1941 he was assistant state chairman for the Young Republican Federation of Oregon and in 1946 was treasurer of the group. He served with the Air Force in Europe from 1942 to 1946, and with the judge advocate division of Supreme European Headquarters.

Twenty-eight years old, he graduated from the University of Oregon in 1940 and received his law degree in 1942. He was born in Eugene and graduated from Eugene schools.

Check-Writers To Pay Fees

Due to the rising cost of operations, customers of the United States National Bank will pay new service charges on checking accounts starting March 1. J. W. Wick, assistant manager of the Eugene branch, said this will be the first adjustment in almost six years.

Under the new schedule, the bank will charge four cents on each deposit made, plus another penny if the deposit involves a check drawn on another bank in the city and two cents on checks from out-of-town banks.

There will be no change in the present charge of four cents each for checks written on the account, Wick said. The action is said to be

in line with similar increases in New York, San Francisco and Seattle.

Officials of the First National Bank of Eugene are conducting a study of the rates and taking under consideration the suggestion of making increases, Rogers W. Kimberling, vice-president and cashier,

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said Thursday.

He explained that the First National is faced with the same problem of rising costs and has made no change in rates since 1942.

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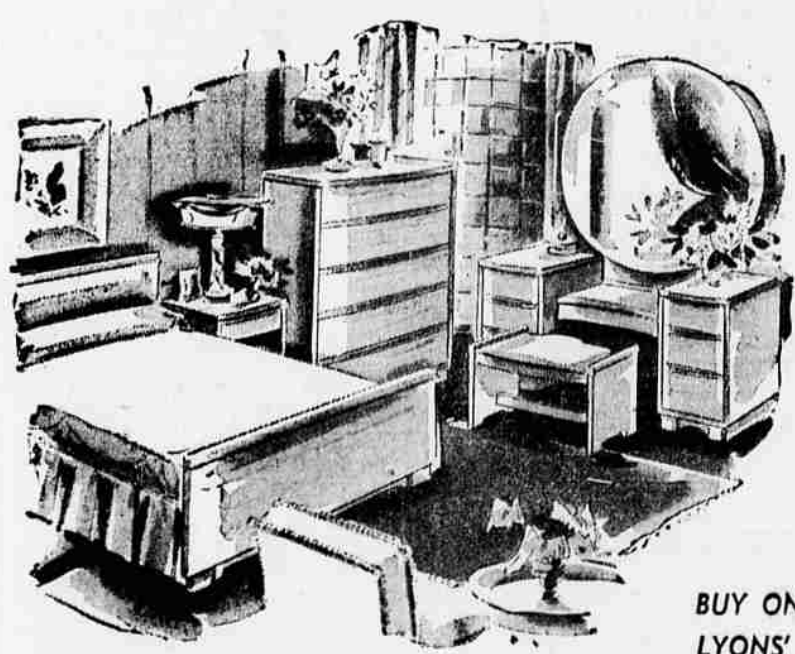
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
