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Foggy Weather Said Covering Activity of Automobile Vandals

New Truck Terminal Nearing Completion

Principal construction work for the new Consolidated Freightways terminal at 150 Adams St. has been completed, and the new terminal may be occupied by March 1, Local Manager John W. Prociw announced Saturday.

Consolidated Freightways now is located at 265 Eighth Ave. W. Prociw said the walls and roof of the two-story terminal are complete with exception of the office area, which should be finished in about two weeks.

The parking area still remains to be paved and some electrical work also must be done. The spur track into the terminal is not yet installed.

The parking area will accommodate between 25 and 30 schedules per day, according to Prociw. Cost of the new terminal is in excess of \$90,000. The contractor is Industrial Building Co. of Eugene.
