

Report Gives Facts, Figures Eugene's School System

Age of 5085 youngsters clearly indicated that a 60 per cent increase must be expected in grade school enrollments by 1953.

These facts are contained in an attractive publication, replete with photographic reproductions and eye-catching graphs, which is being distributed by the Eugene public school system to the city's P-TA organizations, civic and service clubs, and similar community agencies.

The value of this volume, the Eugene schools' annual report for 1947, lies in its concise but comprehensive presentation of facts concerning the performance of the school system last year and in previous years—and presaging the future tasks the system must perform.

Gleemen's McMinnville Trip Successful Despite Sickness

With Don Alliton pinch-hitting as director for Theodore Kratt, who was ill, and Thad Elvington taking over as accompanist for Alliton, the Eugene Gleemen sang a concert in McMinnville High School Thursday evening before a near-capacity crowd.

Sponsored by the McMinnville Rotary Club, proceeds of the concert went to the public school music fund of that city.

Members of the Gleemen said the concert went off very well, despite the last minute changes in director and accompanist.

Guest artist was Pianist Robert Hord, of the University of Oregon music school faculty. James Kay, tenor soloist, was asked to repeat his "Hymn to the Madonna." Other soloists were Will Cook, Paul

are included in the book, but concludes that in the final analysis it is actually a product of the pupils, their parents, and their teachers.

Sections
In its various sections, the report deal with the general instructional program of the 18 separate schools; the special child guidance clinic conducted by Lloyd Gillett and both the continuation high school courses and adult education program under his direction; audio-visual educational aids employed under the supervision of Dale Perry; and health and physical education work directed by Dr. Madeline Marr and the staff of school nurses and physical education instructors.

Special mention is made in a section devoted to the Eugene Vocational School to its enlargement through provision by the federal government of two new buildings from Camp Adair. Also singled out for special comment is FM station KRVN, the school system's own radio outlet which has its main studios at the vocational school.

Lunch Programs
Statistics on the school lunch program show a grand total of 308,689 meals served at 16 different schools where the program is in effect.

The occupation and dedication of Colin Kelly Junior High School, the first new school in the Eugene system since 1925, is listed as a highlight of the 1946-47 school year.

Elections Recorded
The report also records the re-election of G. D. MacLaren for another five-year term on the school board, and the results of the special election in April, 1947, wherein property owners of District 4 approved a \$454,812.13 levy in excess of the six per cent limitation.

Analysis of the increase in pupil enrollment expected as the result of record birth rates in recent years is presented with a series of charts and tables, and the conclusions of this study are correlated with statistics pertaining to the district's financial support of the schools.

Noting that while the per pupil costs of education have almost doubled in the last 20 years, the report further indicates that District 4 tax assessment valuation is up less than 50 per cent. Thus, the district's ability to support its schools is less today than it was in 1927-28.

However, an encouraging note is added in a table which shows that whereas the district was carrying a bonded debt in excess of \$450,000 in 1926-27, its debt in 1948 totals just \$8000.
