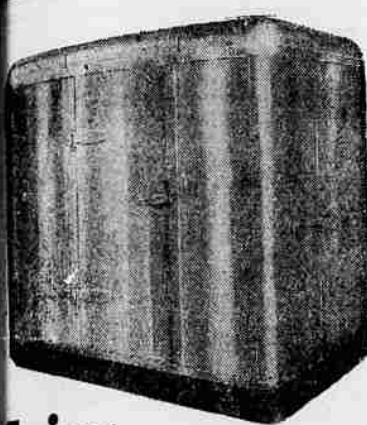


**District 4 Addition

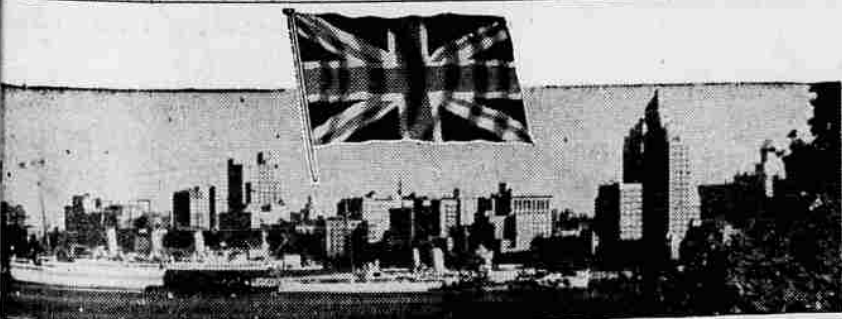

Judge Rules on Crime Cases; Florence Woman Gets Term

Mrs. Luttrell Stonefield, Florence, mother of two, was sentenced to not more than three years in the state penitentiary Monday after she admitted forging some 13 checks in the amount of \$639.
Before passing sentence, Judge G. F. Skipworth considered an application for parole in which Mrs. Stonefield sought leniency on behalf of her family.
She said she had forged another woman's name to the checks because of personal dislike. The checks were drawn on the Florence bank and were honored.

Judge Skipworth ruled that because of the deliberate and wilful nature of the forgeries, the penalty of the law must apply.
In other action Monday, Judge Skipworth continued the case of Peter Fix who had pleaded guilty to a charge of obtaining money under false pretenses. Fix had written a number of small checks totalling \$69 when he had no money in the bank.

Asks Probation
He later attempted to cover the checks and has since made them good. He asked for probation pleading that he had no criminal intent. The judge warned him that he would be sentenced if he passed "one more" bad check.
Louis Edgar Hopper pleaded not guilty to an indictment of burglary and will face a trial by jury at a date to be set. Robert Jessie Younger also entered a plea of not guilty to a charge of grand larceny and will be given a jury trial.

Eagles Presidents End Training School

Seventy new presidents of Eagles Lodges in Oregon met the past weekend at the local Eagles Hall for a training school. Some state committeemen met with them, and W. H. Lynch, secretary of the local lodge and secretary of the state organization board, was chairman of the meeting.

A resolution that the lodges give support to the Children's Hospital School in Eugene was discussed, and a resolutions committee will meet with representatives of the school and of the lodge child welfare committee to draw up a formal resolution for presentation at the state convention of the Eagles Lodge in Portland later this month.

The resolution will then be presented to the convention for approval or rejection. If accepted, committee from the lodge and school will plan assistance for the school.

Coburg School Seeks Ruling on Land Price

The Coburg (Dist. 43) school board prepared Tuesday to bring court action to determine how much it would pay for 3.8 acres of land needed to expand its playground this fall.

The county boundary board Monday had made a resolution instructing the district attorney to draw up a condemnation complaint against Mrs. Robert J. O'Neill, owner of the land adjoining the school ground.
The school board claims it offered \$650 per acre and Mrs. O'Neill wanted \$1200 per acre. The county will have the land appraised and make another offer. If the case comes to trial, a jury will decide what price the land will bring.

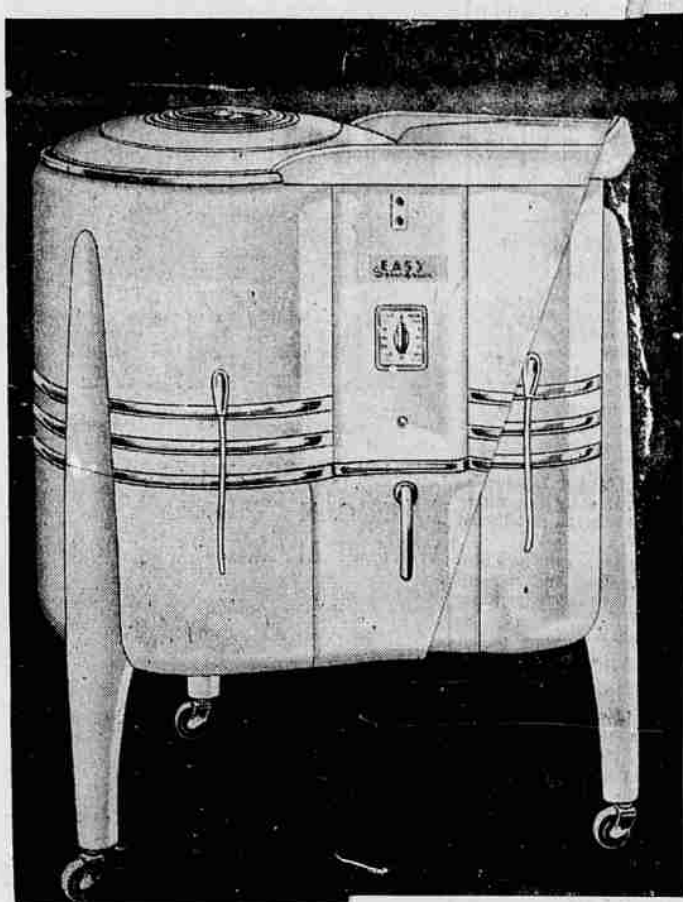

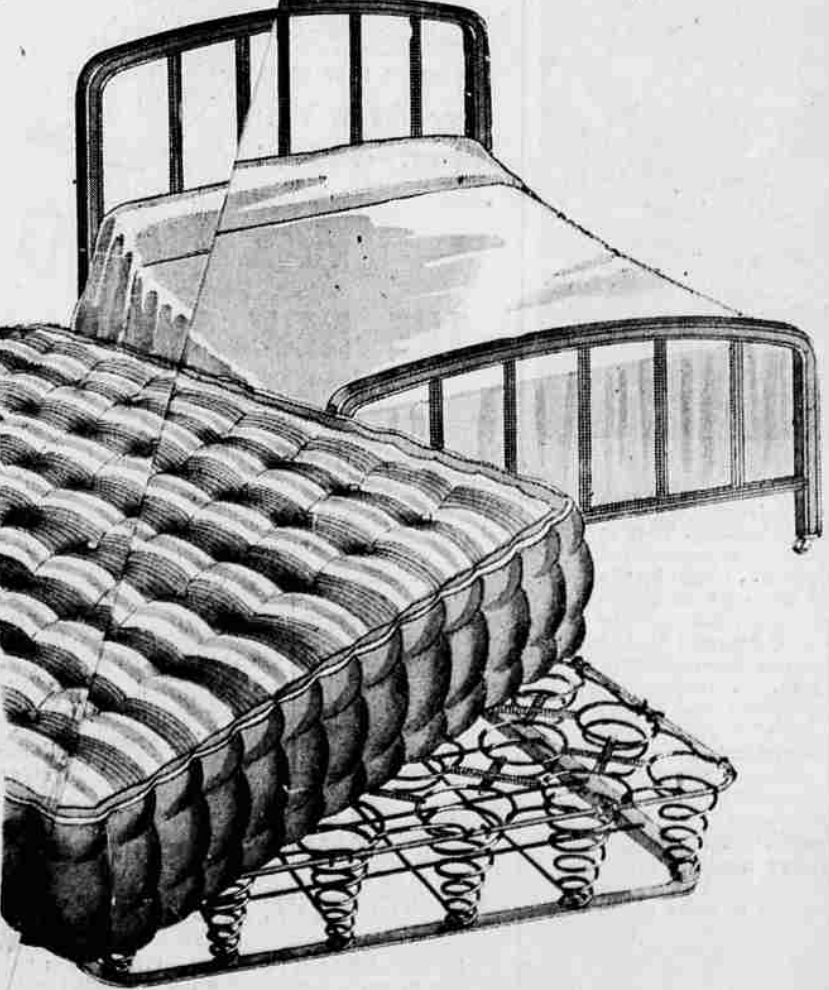

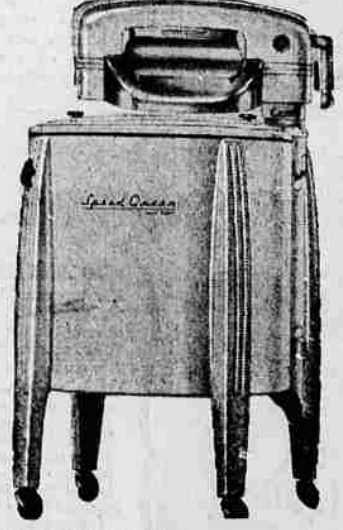
