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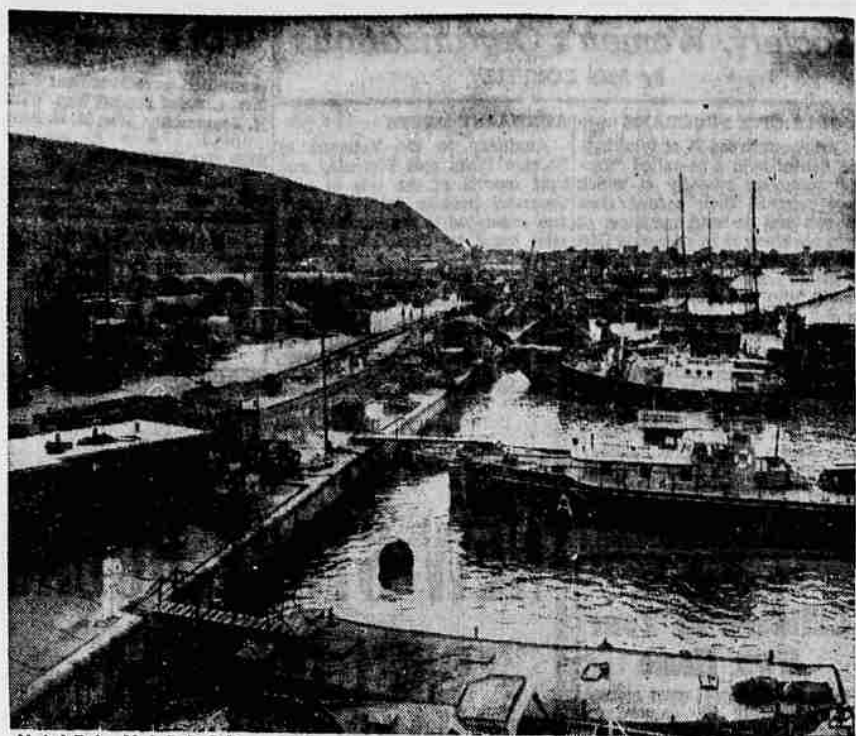

Board Discusses High School, Okays Buying Bus for Oak Hill

The District 4 school board in a meeting with Superintendent Clarence Hines Monday night leafed through and discussed a 12-page document which contained all that has gone into the formal planning of a new high school for Eugene.

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These points seemed to be definite:
Barring a large, unexpected donation of better land, the school will be located between Nineteenth and Twenty Second Ave., E., and Patterson and Pearl Sts.

Financing
It will cost approximately \$1,500,000 and will consist of three wings, the easternmost of which would likely be an auditorium seating between 3000 and 3500 persons; the central section to house the administrative offices, library and classrooms; and the western wing to hold health and physical education gymnasium facilities.

The board will meet with architect Glenn Smith either June 28 or at the first meeting in July to determine if a contract to design the new high school, made with Smith in 1944, is still workable.

The new school must house 1500 students and approximately 55 faculty. Hines said that he hopes to see the first commencement exercise take place in it in 1951. (He also said he wouldn't be surprised if he should be disappointed).

The bond issue with which the structure is to be financed may be drawn to mature over a period of five, ten, fifteen or twenty years. The short terms mean a heavy tax load, but the long terms mean high interest payments. The school board plans to meet with the public, probably some time soon, to get citizen reaction to the plans for financing and building the new school.

In other business Monday night, the school board decided to buy a bus to furnish transportation for children in the newly consolidated Oak Hill district.

School Facilities
A committee from Oak Hill discussed with the board the possibility of having Oak Hill's school children brought into Stella Magladry school until a better elementary school is built at Oak Hill.

A final decision on the matter has been put off until Oak Hill mothers have a chance to compare the facilities at Oak Hill with those of Stella Magladry. District 4 will take over the files and records of Oak Hill after the close of the fiscal year in July.

Religious Vacation School Now Underway

Religious vacation school for Catholic children not attending parochial schools during the winter was underway at St. Mary's Catholic Church in Eugene Tuesday. The classes will continue until Sunday, June 13.

Students begin the day by attending the 8:30 a.m. mass, with classes until 3 p.m. Student's from St. Alice's Catholic Church in Springfield will attend the vacation school in Eugene; transportation is being arranged by the Springfield parents.

Summer religious vacation school, which now enrolls over 800,000 Catholic students in the United States, had its origin in Eugene under the leadership of Rev. E. V. O'Hara, now Bishop O'Hara of Kansas City, Mo. The first summer school was held in 1921, with schools in Springfield, Cottage Grove and Junction City.

Bike Safety Ride Planned

A parade for bicycle riders to promote interest in safer bicycle riding is being sponsored by Montgomery Ward & Co. of Eugene. The parade is scheduled for June 18, beginning at 10 a.m. in front of the Frances Willard School, Thirteenth and Olive.

Prizes will be awarded for the best and most originally decorated bicycles. W. F. Kellogg, manager of the local store, said the prizes will soon be on display in one of the windows.

There will be no registration fee. A set of colorful wheel discs and a list of safety rules will be given to each rider. Any bike rider, young or old, may enter by filling out an entry blank in the store.

Three local citizens are to be chosen as judges to the contest. The parade route is from the school along Olive to Eighth, then right to Willamette St.; south on Willamette to Thirteenth and back to the school.

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Rural Schools Join Springfield

SPRINGFIELD—Voters in four rural school districts approved a proposal to consolidate with Springfield elementary district 19 in an election Monday, according to unofficial returns.

In the Springfield district voters approved the mergers for Upper Camp Creek and Stafford by a count of 34 yes to 3 no, while on a separate issue they approved a proposal to add Goshen District 13 by a total of 30 yes to 7 no.

In the rural districts the returns were: Upper Camp Creek, 15 yes, none against; Lower Camp Creek 32 for, none against; Stafford, 25 yes and 2 no; Goshen, 45 for and 20 against.

The vote results will not be official until canvassed by the county boundary board.
