

Churches Plan Annual Institute

OREGON STATE COLLEGE—The third annual institute for town and country churches will be held here July 12 to 16 with indications that at least 125 will attend, according to H. C. Seymour, chairman of the planning committee. Program arrangements are in charge of Dr. E. W. Warrington, head of the department of religion here.

Board and room will be available to delegates in college dormitories at nominal cost if reservation staff will include representatives from the Home Missions Council of North America, the National Catholic Rural Life conference, regional religious leaders and members of the state college staff. This year's theme deals with integrating the rural church with the life of the community.

"This picture will be of special interest because it will give insight of the status of Christianity in China," said Rev. Hugh Mc-

Callum, chairman of the local film committee. He said the Chinese are now providing their own missionaries, making it possible to produce a film of the Christian missions movement without showing Occidental workers.

The documentary film shows the work of a Chinese minister, doctor, missionary school teacher, and an agricultural expert, filling the religious needs of their own people without assistance from the western world. The film will be free to the public, but a free will offering will be taken.
