# Killer-Brave Clash

Miller Lumbermen and Don Braves, 1947 pennant winners, will clash in what promises to be a good baseball game at 1:30 p.m. Sunday. Game time is 1:30 p.m.

The Lumbermen and Braves are gunning for a victory in a threatening battle behind the league-leading Don Braves in the Cascade League and a defeat will hand the Lumbermen a chance to win the league championship race that will be completed Sunday.

The game will also mark the first time for all four clubs to cut into the necessary 15-inning period when the Lumbermen will become eligible for relief duty. The other three newcomers are also slated to play their first Cascade League games.

# Valley Golf Tourney To Be Here in July

Plans were announced here Saturday for the 12th annual Willamette Valley Golf Association team and individual championships, to be played over the Eugene Country Club course July 17-18.

The local par-72 course will also be available July 16 for practice rounds, according to Chairman Joyce Dutton.

Eastmoreland of Portland captured its fourth championship and third straight last year when the 36-hole medal event was held on both the Club and Laurelwood courses—18 holes on each course. The Laurelwood course will be unable to accommodate the golfers this year.

Lou Stafford, who makes the Eugene course his home course as a member of the University of Oregon team, took medalist honors last year as a member of the Eastmoreland team that nosed out Eugene 889 to 892. He fired 65-73-138, with Rod Taylor of Eugene winning runner-up honors with 70-71-141.

The team championship is decided on the aggregate 36-hole scores for six-man teams, with only one team permitted to entry from one club.

Invitations for the tournament will be mailed out within the next few days, and clubs not contacted can secure information by writing Dutton or Wendell Wood, Eugene Country Club pro.

The Laurelwood team has been the only other to win the title more than once, taking the crown four times. Eugene, Salem, Albany and Broadmoor of Portland have been single winners.

The tournament was inaugurated in 1933, but was not held during the war years of 1942-43-44-45.

# Young Springfield Rifleman Has Outstanding Target Record

Darold Bolin after two years of activity can look back on a rifle-shooting career with pleasure, indeed. Since his debut to the target sport the young 18-year Springfield High School student has won every award offered by the National Rifle Association for junior shooters.

Just recently Bolin was notified that he will receive the Distinguished Rifleman's Badge, which is the highest award offered by the NRA for junior shooters. To qualify for the award young Bolin had to meet the following requirements: 100 shots each from prone and sitting positions with a minimum score of 900 out of a possible 1000. 100 shots each from kneeling and standing positions with a minimum score of 800 out of a possible 1000.

In addition to his NRA award Darold recently qualified for the Army Junior Expert badge — the highest award the Army gives to junior shooters.

Up to date Darold has competed in only indoor meets but July 11 he plans to compete in the Oregon State Junior Outdoor Championships at Clackamas. Bolin will be accompanied to the meet by his instructor, Rudy King, and three other members of the Springfield High Rifle Club.
