Miss Gladys Chase, who left here Saturday from San Francisco on the S.S. General Meigs, on the President Line. She expects to arrive in Yokohama in a few days, where she will be met by Miss Margaret Cuddeback, formerly of Eugene and daughter of Mr. and Mrs. S. V. Cuddeback, 1915 Fairmount Street. She is in charge of the Christian Center at Osaka. Together, they will travel to Osaka to do some buying and to visit the mission fields. They then

will return to Osaka, and from Miss Cuddeback's home they plan to "do" Japan.

Eugene friends were most generous, Miss Chase reported before her departure, in furnishing her with supplies to take to Miss Cuddeback's mission. These gifts are to be a surprise to the missionary and her friend was anticipating her pleasure.

Several Chinese students now in Eugene have given Miss Chase letters of introduction to family and friends in China, which undoubtedly will make her visit there more pleasant. Miss Cuddeback will provide her with entree to homes in Japan, where the former has spent a number of years in missionary work, most of it before the war.

Miss Chase plans to return to Eugene in September.

Music Teachers' Convention Opens on Campus Today

Opening of the thirty-third annual convention of the Oregon Music Teachers' Association, with headquarters at the School of Music of the University of Oregon, takes place this evening, when the first program of music will be offered the public. The faculty of the university school will present a program by Donald W. Allton, organist; the University String Quartet; Herman Gelhausen, bass-baritone, and Robert Hord, pianist. It will begin at eight o'clock in the auditorium of the school of music.

Official registration will start Monday morning at eight-thirty o'clock, and the business meeting will begin at nine-thirty. The president, Miss Alice Clement will call the meeting to order, and invocation will be given by the Rev. Henry Marcotte of Central Presbyterian Church. Dean Theodore Kratt is to give the address of welcome and response will be given by Lucia Hart Tebault, president of the Portland district. Roll call and reports will follow. A program of music will be offered at eleven

o'clock, and to this, as to all programs, the public is invited. It will present Ralph Dobbs, pianist, from Willamette University.

Luncheon will be at twelve-fifteen, in the dining hall. Music librarians are to be honored, and there will be talks by Nellie Tholen, chairman of education, speaking on "The 1948 Music Festival," and by Dr. Arnold Elston of the host group. A program of music will be offered by Maybelle Townsend, pianist, from Lewis and Clark College, and Kurt Berndt violinist, Portland public schools; Harriet De Vito, of the Portland School of Music, will be their accompanist.

George Frederick McKay of the University of Washington is to lecture at two o'clock on "A Survey of American Music." Paul Bentley is scheduled at three o'clock on "Revival of the Plain Chant." Educational films will follow.

Mrs. E. Overmeyer, Queen of Zuleima Temple of Ashland, and other officers of the temple will be honored as guests of the local club at this time.

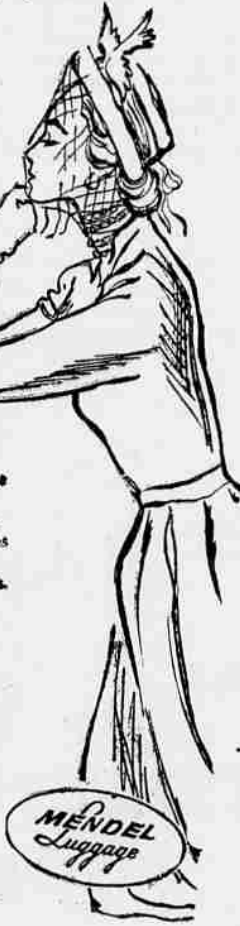
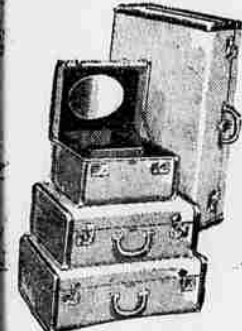
