

### Fire Equipment Bond Issue Council Topic

SPRINGFIELD—On the agenda for the regular meeting on the city council here Monday, June 14,

at 7:30 p.m. will be an ordinance covering the sale and issuance of \$19,000 worth of bonds for fire equipment voted by the city last May 21.

The ordinance will set a date for receipt of sealed bids for the bonds.

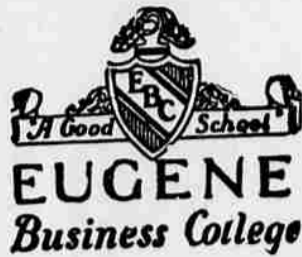
In connection with this ordinance, the council will set a date for opening of sealed bids for a 750 gal. pumper type fire truck.

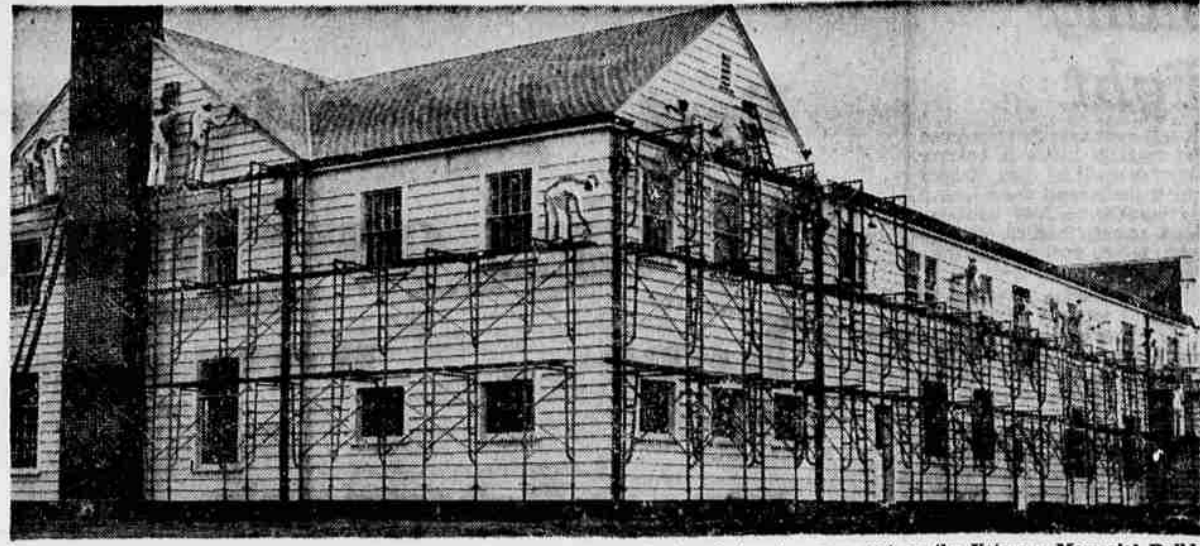

About 38 men turned out Saturday to cover 1000 square feet of the Veterans Memorial Building with white paint—and in about four hours working time.

The mass painting, sponsored by the Local Painters Union 1277, AFL, and Eugene Chapter of Painting and Decorating Contractors of America, came as a logical conclusion to the two-week Junior Chamber of Commerce Clean-Up Fix-Up campaign.

Junior Chamber hopes that residents of Eugene will continue to improve the appearance of the city on an individual basis.

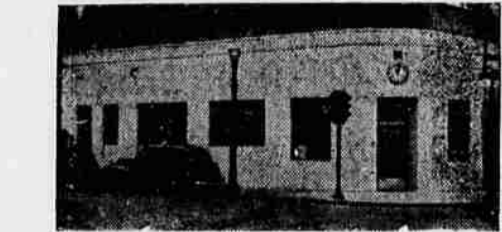
