### General Fund Budget Item

WILSONFIELD - Largest expenditure in the proposed 1948-49 budget for this city are the general fund—the fund which all but two of the departments operate.

Estimated expenditures for the general fund, which covers fire protection, building inspection and emergency public library and emergency fund, are \$123,591. This is about 10 per cent more than expenditures for the general fund in the current fiscal year budget.

Expenditures for the current fiscal year budget are many additional services and equipment for better operation without the cost of a tax raise due to the inflation which doubled the assessed value.

Expenditures by departments (with 1947-48 expenditures in parentheses) are: general fund, including city manager, auditor and treasurer, city stenographic service, city judge, the operation of accounts and utility accounts, \$37,088 (\$26,402); fire department, \$31,693 (\$19,871); police department, \$37,122 (\$23,988); public library, \$10,907 (\$8,229); and emergency fund, \$3,000.

Wages for all city departments, except the fire department, have been given ten per cent "cost of living" salary increases. For example, the base salary for a fireman has been raised from \$185 per month to \$214.50 per month.

Increases in general, the increased operating costs are due to the rapid growth of the city and the greater work load it brings to the department.

Here is a brief picture of some of the added items the budget committee felt were minimum needs in each department under the general fund.

**General Control**—No personnel increases but \$2150 budgeted for purchase of additional land for the new city hall; \$3750 for three more traffic lights on Main St., tentatively slated for Second, Seventh and Fourteenth St. intersections; \$2400 for an engineering survey of the city's water supply and system now operated by Mountain States Power Co., with an eye to possible municipal ownership. There are also slightly increased operating costs due to expected occupancy of the new city hall the latter half of fiscal year.

**Fire Protection**—Fire department will have total personnel of nine men including fire chief instead of six provided under present budget. This is part of program to meet requirements of Oregon Insurance Rating Bureau so the city can retain present fire insurance rates. Provisions are also made for increasing the volunteer firemen from 17 to 24 men, as part of the rating bureau requirements. Under capital outlay in the fire department budget, a utility vehicle to be used by the fire chief for inspection service and for fire clean-up work is provided.

**Police Protection**—Police department personnel is increased from eight to 11 men including the police chief. The budget committee decided the increase was necessary because of the larger area of the city to cover and also the committee had to consider occupation of the new city hall which will require a desk sergeant on duty 24 hours to provide a jail guard.

**Building Inspection**—The budget committee added an assistant building inspector to the department because they felt one man could not cover the larger city area adequately and at the same time provide more efficient building construction counseling. Under capital outlay in this department, a pick-up truck is budgeted. This vehicle will serve a two-fold purpose by use in both building inspection and engineering departments for utility and equipment purposes.

**Public Library**—The librarian's salary is increased from \$900 to \$1200 and a library helper is provided. Under capital outlay, \$720 is budgeted for purchase of reading material.

To keep pace with larger operations the emergency fund is increased \$1000 over the current budget figure.

Registered voters in the city will be asked to pass on a request of the budget committee to exceed the statutory six per cent limitation Tuesday June 15 in what may prove to be of the most important special elections in the city's history.
