Hall Predicts Dewey Win
NEW YORK—(AP)—Gov. John H. Hall of Oregon believes Gov. Thomas E. Dewey of New York will win the Republican presidential nomination.
He told an interviewer here Friday night that sentiment at the governors' conference in New Hampshire earlier this week and among voters on the West Coast was for Dewey.
Regarding the possibility that Gov. Earl Warren of California might accept a vice-presidential nomination, Hall said:
"I think Earl might be willing to run with Vandenberg (Sen. Arthur Vandenberg of Michigan). But I don't think he would with Dewey or (Harold E.) Stassen, both younger men."
After a day of sightseeing here, the Oregon governor went on to Washington, D. C., where he will seek additional funds for his flood-hit state.

Ream, 56, was serving 20 years for rape. He was sentenced from Polk county in 1933. Prison guards found him missing at the 9 a.m. count Thursday, but his escape was not made public until late in the day.

Haberdasher Blames Air Conditioning
PHILADELPHIA—(AP)—Benjamin N. Banks, operator of a Philadelphia haberdashery, was given the air in common pleas court and Benjamin was well pleased.
