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Giustina, Millers Collide Sunday

Johnson Opens For Lumbermen

The war-whooping Giustina Indians, following their 4-1 upset of the champion Snellstrom Braves Friday night, will be on the warpath for the Miller Lumbermen at Civic Stadium Sunday when the two clubs clash in a Cascade League baseball tilt. Game time will be 2:30 p. m.

Although two full games behind the league-leading Hills Creek Billies, the Indians have an outside chance for the first-half pennant — providing Manager Ed Brauner can uncover Fred "Lefty" Gay, ex-coast league pitcher who was expected to start Friday's game — won by Cliff Mortensen with a five-hit job.

If Gay doesn't show, it is rumored that Brauner is negotiating a trade with Snellstrom for Dick DeBernardi, University of Oregon righthanded pitcher, who would get the starting assignment. Otherwise either Dick Wilkins' Ron Espling, or Ken Brauner would get the call.

Johnson Likely Starter

Manager Don Kirsch's mound assignment for the Lumbermen is nearly as problematical, but it appears likely his choice will be DeWayne Johnson, promising southpaw. Other possibilities are Frank Dierickx, Don Reed, or even Bud Brewer, who hurled a 6-0 shutout against Hills Creek Wednesday.

The Giustina club has been strengthened greatly, particularly by Gene Tansell at short and Johnny Kovenz in the outfield. In beating Snellstrom Friday the Indians displayed great defensive strength.

Leading hitters for the Indians are Outfielder Howard Robertson, 400, and Mortensen, who will likely be in the outfield, at 357.

Eddie Adams Hitting .467

The Lumbermen have a classy lineup that possesses as much defensive strength as any club in the circuit — and hitting power to burn. Catcher Eddie Adams is clouting at a .467 clip, followed by Firstbaseman Johnny Bubalo at .438, Outfielder Bill Carney at .375, and Thirdbaseman Barney Kock at .353.

All four clubs are just rounding into mid-season form and some of the best baseball in years is being played at the local park, and the last three games have been played in 1:32, 1:41, and 1:28.

Utah's Peterson Heads Hoop Study

The University of Oregon's coaching school, to be held from June 28 through July 3, is expected to attract one of the largest attendances in history — because of the "name" personnel for basketball and football courses.

Dr. Paul Jacobson, director of the summer session, announced this week that final arrangements have been made with Vadal Peterson, veteran University of Utah basketball coach, to head Oregon's hoop coaching course, assisted by John Warren, University of Oregon coach.

Peterson is recognized as one of the top — ranking basketball mentors in the nation and his Indians won the National Invitational tournament title at Madison Square Garden in 1947, and the NCAA championship in 1944.

The football course will be conducted by Stu Holcomb, head coach at Purdue University, and assisted by Oregon's Jim Aiken.

The school is certain to attract coaches from every section of the nation, and one of the visitors will be Gordon Ridings of Columbia University whose Lions have won the Eastern Intercollegiate League basketball title for the past two seasons.

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Deadline Set For Valley Golf

Deadline for entries in the Willamette Valley Golf Association championships, to be staged at the Eugene Country Club July 16-17-18, has in past years been ignored, but the July 10 deadline for the 12th annual event this year will be iron-bound. That announcement was made Saturday by Joyce Dutton, new general chairman for the tournament.

Invitations to the tournament were sent out last week and clubs that have not received the entrance blanks are asked to contact Dutton or Pro Wendell Wood at the Eugene Country Club.

Dutton pointed out that the opening date for the event will be for practice rounds, and that each entrant will be required to play 18 holes July 17 and 18. The low aggregate score of all six members of the team will decide the team championship.

Defending champions are Eastmoreland of Portland and Lou Stafford.

Each club will be limited to an entry of one squad. There were 14 teams entered last year.

The Eugene Country Club team, expected to be a heavy favorite, will be selected on the basis of 36-hole qualifying rounds, to be played July 9-10 and limited to players with handicaps of 4 or less.

Laurelwood will require 72-hole qualifying tests, the first 36 holes scheduled Sunday.

The Oakway Public Golf Course will hold qualifying rounds for Valley Golf entrants all of next week, June 20 to the 26.
