SALEM.—O.R.—Salem's crowded airport lost two of its flood-born customers Thursday when Western Airlines and Northwest Airlines announced they will transfer their facilities to Troutdale airport east of Portland.
 Both companies had moved their Portland headquarters to Salem when the Columbia flood threatened to wash them out of the Portland-Columbia airport.
 Later flood waters covered the Portland field making it impossible for their return there.
 Meanwhile United Air Lines is expanding its facilities here and plans to operate out of Salem indefinitely.

Colorado Diverted For Fourth Time

BOULDER CITY, Nev.,—O.R.—The mighty Colorado River was diverted from its channel for the fourth time Thursday.
 Engineers turned water into a

4500 foot diversion channel to facilitate construction of the \$104,000,000 Davis Dam, 89 miles below Hoover Dam near the point where California, Arizona and Nevada meet.
