

Canadian Socialists Return to Power

REGINA, Sask.—(UPI)—Canada's only Socialist government returned to power Friday in the Saskatchewan provincial elections as Premier Thomas C. Douglas' co-operative commonwealth federation party was conceded victory by opposition groups.

Almost complete returns from Thursday's election showed the CCF with 31 of the 52 legislative seats.



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Pre-paid Medical Care Plans Discussed by Pioneer in Field

Plans for pre-paid medical care depend upon the participation of the public and upon the public's cooperation in not "overusing" the service, Dr. Wells Baum, past president of the Oregon State Medical Society and a pioneer in the field of pre-paid medicine, told the Health Education Workshop on the University of Oregon campus Thursday.

Physicians are generally eager for pre-paid medical care schemes to succeed, he told the physical education students, but are justifiably chary of many of them which promise too much for too little.

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Full coverage for whole families has generally been proved unsound financially, he said, because people have a tendency to get all they can get out of the service, regardless of true need.

The plans don't go broke on the big operations and big hospital bills, he said, but are likely to prove financially unsound on the small office calls.

Therefore the most successful plans are likely to be those in which the patient pays the small fee, looking toward the associations only for the large "disaster" expenses.

Tracing the history of pre-paid medicine, he said that Oregon has pioneered consistently in this field and that the Oregon plans have attracted nation-wide attention since 1930 when a group of Salem physicians began operating cooperatively among industrial groups.

Dr. Baum warned the students against confusing pre-paid medicine with insurance. He quoted "insurance laws" which he said made it plain that care of this type could not be carried out on the insurance basis.

Third Party Offering No Real Improvements, Wood States

Dr. Louis A. Wood, prominent Lane County Democrat, lashed out Thursday at the Third Party wing of the Democrats, which he declared offered voters no real improvements in domestic legislation and offered only disaster in international policy.

Speaking before the Jane Jefferson Club (Democratic Women's) luncheon Thursday, Dr. Wood declared that disturbing problems have been created for Oregon Democrats by the Third Party's appearance within the ranks of the Democratic party.

"Opposition" He declared that in only a small way, however, can these be traced to the ailment which the Wallace cause has had for a proportion of earnest and fair-minded Democrats, from whom, if they continue their course it will be hard to part company.

Rather said Dr. Wood, such problems have developed from the fact that promoters of the Third Party in Oregon, as a matter of strategy, have been busily laying and executing plans to deflate, and so far as possible, decompose the Democratic Party in the state before finally leaving it.

The tactics followed have been to besmirch and belittle the Washington administration, to inspire confused thinking and often dissension among rank and file Democrats.

The result has been a great impairment of county organization and activities, with the November election just four months away.

"Under the circumstances, I believe that the Democratic Party must take immediate steps to tighten its lines," Dr. Wood said.

Egg Prices Advance Penny on All Grades

All egg prices at the public market advanced one cent Friday. Marketmaster Fred Knox explained that this increase brings prices into line with Portland markets.

The increase is said to be due to high feed costs and a smaller supply of available eggs. Many of the smaller egg producers have killed chickens in the face of rising operating expenses. Another explanation of the diminishing supply is the normal decline in laying during this time of the year.

New prices at the market are as follows: Jumbos, 71 cents; oversize, 66 cents; grade A large, 63 cents; grade A medium, 59 cents; and grade A small, 56 cents.

"It should be impressed on party members that, domestically, the Third Party has nothing to offer that is not contained in the progressive policies of the Democratic Party. Abroad, it asks us to bow down before a huge Moloch, to whom must be sacrificed a thousand years of European culture."

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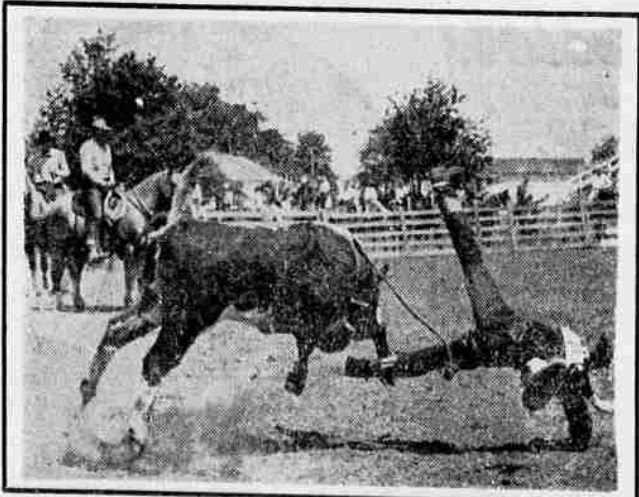
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
