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Juvenile Staff Member Quits

John E. Sarchett, for the past eight months assistant juvenile officer since the resignation of John Myers last month, announced Wednesday that he had resigned effective July 1.

Sarchett will join the probation officer's staff at Yakima, Wash., Aug. 1, "at a substantial increase in salary," he said.

Judge G. F. Skipworth said he had been looking for a successor in the juvenile department for nearly two months after he was notified that both officers planned to leave.

Until a permanent juvenile officer is engaged, Judge Skipworth said he would ask a vacationing school teacher to serve in the interim.

Fire Wrecks Dallas Plant

DALLAS (AP)—Fire destroyed the Dallas Lumber and Supply Company here early Wednesday. Loss was estimated at \$80,000.

Three nearby structures were threatened before firemen controlled the flames. Slight damage was caused by heat to the Christian Science Church and the Imperial apartments, the latter a 40-unit structure from which tenants were evacuated.

Firemen believed the blaze was caused by spontaneous combustion and said the fire was beyond control when the first apparatus arrived.

The loss estimate was made by L. B. Harris, a company official. He said the razed building and stock were covered by insurance.

Airlines to Operate From Troutdale Port

PORTLAND (AP)—Western, Northwestern and West Coast airlines Wednesday announced jointly that they will begin commercial operations from the Troutdale airport Thursday, July 1.

The main Portland-Columbia airport was abandoned temporarily because of flood conditions. Since the Portland airport was evacuated, commercial planes have been operating in and out of Salem.

Life Term Back In Oregon's Pen

SALEM (AP)—A life term prisoner who escaped the Oregon penitentiary last October has been recaptured in Caldwell, Idaho, prison officials said Wednesday.

The convict, Joseph Fogel, convicted as a habitual criminal in 1928, was picked up in the Idaho city on a charge of burglary.

Mrs. Florence Herman, former resident of Junction City, died Monday at a Portland hospital. She was born in Canada, and moved to South Bend, Wash. when still quite young. She later moved to Junction City then to Canby.

Flood Damages Beer Cache

KELSO, Wash. (AP)—There was suds on the nearby Longview garbage dump Wednesday as officers began dumping 506 cases of beer, casualty of the Columbia River flood.

State food and drug inspectors ordered the owner of a Kelso tavern to destroy the 506 cases that had been stored in a basement which was flooded. The inspectors said they found lines of silt under cork gaskets at the top of some individual bottles, and ordered the lot—all 506 cases—destroyed for fear the beer might have become contaminated.

Department Halts Burning Permits

The City Bureau of Fire Prevention announced Wednesday that no burning permits will be issued until further notice due to the current spell of hot, low-humidity weather.

Fire Marshal Lester Barker reminded citizens that the burning of trash or grass within the city limits can be done only after a permit has been granted at the fire department.

"Right now," Barker added, "the risk is too great."

Fire Chief E. L. Surfus amplified Barker's statement with a report that fire crews answered four alarms Tuesday which resulted from grass and rubbish fires getting out of control.

At 3:08 p. m. a rubbish fire had to be quelled at 26th and Willamette, at 7:30 p. m. the department was called to fight a grass fire at Fourteenth and Grant; at 7:59 another trash fire brought an alarm from 168 N. Grand, and at 9:35 p. m. the department had to control another trash fire.
