The first Assembly of the World Council of Churches will meet in Amsterdam, Holland, from August 22 to September 4. This is an event of great significance and interest to all Christians.

For more than 140 churches from 42 countries have already accepted membership in the provisional World Council of Churches; churches in Japan, Siam and Formosa being among the latest.

Now comes the first Assembly of the World Council of Churches. The council has existed in a preliminary form for ten years.

SEATTLE—Two, and possibly three, new bishops will be elected at the Western Jurisdictional Conference of the Methodist Church which meets here, July 7 to 11, at First Church. Official delegates numbering 112, equally divided between ministerial and lay, will represent the nearly half million members of the denomination's 1500 churches in ten far-western states.
