National Education Magazine Commends Clarence Diebel

Clarence Diebel, physics and chemistry instructor at Eugene High School, is featured as a living example of "What Good Teachers Are Like" in the July issue of School Life, official journal of the U.S. Office of Education.

Diebel, now at Drake University instructing summer courses in how to teach elementary science, brought national recognition to himself and Eugene—the article explains—by turning out top winners in the Westinghouse science talent search for three years running.

"Not more than three or four other high schools in the country have approached this remarkable record," the author of the magazine feature comments.

Background Sketched

Sketching the background of the man who told her that "all teachers ought to be tops as people and as students before they're even permitted in a classroom with youngsters," Author Frances V. Rummel notes that Diebel worked his way through college, hopping tables for his meals and playing the drums with dance orchestras.

"And," the story continues, "when he and his wife, Marie, scraped together enough money to buy a lot, they built their own house with their own hands—a charmingly spacious six-room house with picture windows and glistening woodwork and storage space in the kitchen filled with a variety of fruits and vegetables that, together, they preserve fresh from their own garden."

No Impracticability

"This is all to say," the writer then adds, "that an aura of vague impracticability does not accom-

pany Diebel's scholarly mien." As a sidelight on the success of his students in the annual Westinghouse science competitions, the article describes how in 1945 the Eugene instructor's older son Norman "proudly embarrassed him by being chosen of the nation's 40 finalists invited to Washington, D.C., to compete for national scholarships."

"Diebel heard the exciting news," according to the account, "when he was high on a stepladder, tinkering with the electric bell system on the school clock."

Bell Went Wrong

Then quoting the subject directly: "I nearly fell off the stepladder... and the bell system went haywire. The bell rang at odd intervals all day. I really fixed school that day."

After Alice Kingman was chosen in the 1946 talent search and Dorothy Christensen the next year, Author Rummel goes on, "the Eugene Register-Guard published an editorial singling out Diebel for praise. Two days later, the editor published Diebel's reply. 'The prominent mention of my name calls for comment,' he wrote. 'Norman, Alice Kingman, and Dorothy Christensen have had during their school careers about 30 teachers, and I'm only one of them...'"

Society Advised

"I hope," the article continues in quoting his letter to the editor, "the public enthusiasm that is displayed when such honors come to our school will mean that more serious thought will be given to the rights of every boy and girl in our schools. Society must assume its responsibility of giving education the opportunity to function effectively by providing the necessary adequate financial support. Society is paying a devastating penalty when this responsibility is shirked."

Noting with some surprise that Diebel has turned down college offers with a statement, "I like high school kids. I have a feeling for them," Miss Rummel reports that he has "pieced out" his teacher's salary (\$2258 in 1944; \$3600 under the new salary schedule) by testing electric meters for the Water Board, by teaching evening classes in organic chemistry to student nurses, and by working summers and weekends in the S.P. roundhouse or as a carpenter.

Concluding his remark that teachers should be tops as people and as students, the article finally quotes him as saying "If there has to be any difference in quality, then the best teachers ought to be in our elementary schools and the next best in high schools."

Annual 4-H Summer Camp Starts Sunday

The annual 4-H summer camp will get under way Sunday at Camp Clark, in the upper Fall Creek area, with more than 100 youngsters scheduled to attend the week's outing, John R. Gurton, county club agent, reported Wednesday.

Two items of heavy equipment for the camp have been furnished by local merchants, Gurton said. An electrical power plant to light up the camp area has been loaned by Sears-Roebuck and Co.; and the camp cook stove has been loaned by the Magic Gas Co. of Eugene.

Alleged Assassin Killed By Angry Haitian Mob

PORT-AU-PRINCE, Haiti (AP)—A Haitian publisher was slain Tuesday in a downtown street. A short time later angry mobs wrested his alleged assassin from police and killed him.

A government communique said Jean Remy, director of the official government newspaper Le Moniteur and owner of the news-

paper La Republique, was shot three times as he stepped from his car.

Police immediately arrested Gerard Viau, described as a young poet and member of a government printing office for questioning. They said a mob forced its way into the office, overpowered them and shot Viau several times.

County Bond Sales Totaled

Residents of Lane County purchased \$60,708 worth of U.S. Savings Bonds during the week ended June 26 to send the total bought

thus far to \$840,205. This is approximately 41 per cent of the quota assigned for the drive.

Although the bond drive officially ended June 30, all sales until July 17 will be credited to the county. At the present time, Lane County is in 20th place in the list of 36 counties. The leading county, Lincoln, has sold 80 per

cent of quota. The state average is now 41 per cent of its quota of over 23 million dollars. Vernon L. Clark, state director of the drive, sent a letter of encouragement to county workers in recognition of their valiant effort to sell bonds in face of the flood disaster.
