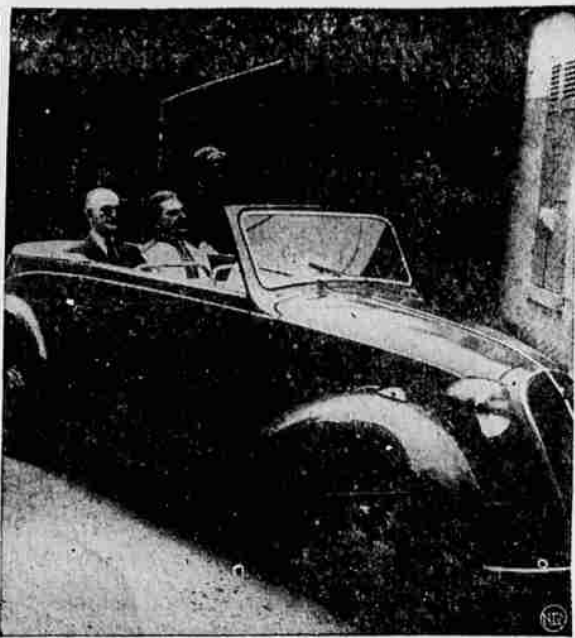

WASHINGTON, (UP) — Secretary of Navy John L. Sullivan this week welcomed women into what has always been a man's world — the regular Navy.

They were the first naval reserve Waves to transfer to the regulars under the new law setting up a permanent women's corps in the Navy. The Navy said it would welcome a lot more reserve women into regular ranks any time they want to come.

Surrounded by newsmen and cameramen, the six women, all enlisted, were sworn in by Rear Adm. George L. Russell in Sullivan's office.

The secretary praised the "brave and unselfish service which represented the best in valor, courage and sacrifice in the true tradition of American women" of naval reserve waves in the last war.
