## Heart Disease Leads In Toll

Of the 98 deaths reported for June by the health office Tuesday, heart disease killed 35, cancer 12, and miscellaneous ailments or accidents the remainder.

There were three still births and eight infant deaths, as well as one child who died as a result of an infant ailment.

Automobile accidents killed five in Lane County last month, according to the City-County Health Department's monthly report.

One adult died as a result of measles.

In the communicable disease report, the health office listed 28 known cases of measles in June, compared to only one reported a year ago.

Other communicable diseases reported in June, and compared with those of a year ago, included chicken pox, seven and ten; gonorrhoea, two and six; mumps, two and one; syphilis, two and six; tuberculosis, none and five; and whooping cough, none and two. There were 41 communicable disease cases reported, as compared to 34 last year, but the increase was more than accounted for by the increase in measles, which reached near-epidemic proportions early in June.
